Saffron: 1. the deep orange-colored stigmas of a type of crocus, sometimes ground to a powder. Use: food colorant, flavoring. 2. a crocus thought to have originated from the Greek island of Crete whose flowers produce saffron. Native to: Europe, South and Southwest Asia. Flowers: showy, purple or white.

Onesie: one-piece adult loungewear jumpsuit
Capoeira: a martial art and dance form, originally from Brazil, that is used to promote physical fitness and grace of movement

Transcendent: superior in quality or achievement
Coveralls: a one-piece outer garment that covers and protects the clothes
Polyamory: any of various practices involving romantic or sexual relationships with multiple partners with the knowledge and consent of all involved

Heteronormative: of or pertaining to the practices and institutions that privilege or value heterosexuality, heterosexual relationships, and traditional gender roles as fundamental and "natural" within society

Crochet: a form of needlework used to make clothes or decorative items from wool or thick stiff thread by looping the wool or thread through itself with a hooked needle, a crochet hook

Chiropractic: a medical system based on the theory that disease and disorders are caused by a misalignment of the bones, especially in the spine, that obstructs proper nerve functions

Classy: very stylish and elegant
Gazebo: a small, usually open-sided and slightly elevated building, situated in a spot that commands a pleasant view

Maca: the Andean medicinal herb Lepidium meyenii, or an extract of the root of this plant

Chi: in Chinese medicine and philosophy, the energy or life force of the universe, believed to flow round the body and to be present in all living things. The manipulation of chi is the basis of acupuncture and Chinese martial arts.

Eat up: to receive something with enthusiasm or pleasure
Flatware: 1. knives, forks, and spoons used for eating 2. dishes used for eating that are flat or relatively shallow, e.g. plates and saucers, as opposed to deeper pieces (hollowware)

There, there: conveys comfort; used to calm somebody or urge somebody to relax, especially when the person is crying

Shumai: a traditional steamed Chinese pork dumpling served in dim sum
Poetry slam: a competition at which poets recite their poems before an audience and are given scores by judges

Hickey: a mark on the skin caused especially by kissing, biting, or sucking and associated with physical intimacy

Asparagus: spear-shaped young plant shoots, eaten cooked as a vegetable
Nightcap: 1. a drink, often alcoholic, taken before going to bed 2. the last event of a day of sports, especially the second game of a baseball doubleheader

Chariot: a four-wheeled horse-drawn carriage with rear seats only, used especially on ceremonial occasions

Carpaccio: a dish of raw beef or tuna sliced thinly, moistened with olive oil and lemon juice, and seasoned

Shot glass: a small glass used to hold or measure a small quantity of liquor
Sellout: a betrayer of a principle or cause for money or something else
Walk-in: a customer, patient, or interviewee who is served or seen without an appointment, e.g. at a barber shop or doctor's office

Shiitake: a dark-colored mushroom with an edible fleshy cap. Native to: East Asia.

Parfait: 1. a sweet dish composed of various layers, including ice cream, fruit, syrup, and whipped cream 2. a rich dessert consisting of frozen whipped cream or rich ice cream flavored with fruit

Duck: to bend or move the head down quickly, especially to avoid being hit by something

Oculus: an architectural feature that is round or eye-shaped, e.g. a round window, a round opening at the top of a dome, or the central boss of a volute

Pugilism: the practice, sport, or profession of boxing
Peon: somebody who does boring menial tasks
Eon: a length of time that is too long to measure
Measure up: to be good enough to meet a standard
Coldcock: to knock somebody unconscious, especially with a blunt instrument

Denture: a partial or complete set of artificial teeth for the upper or lower jaw, usually attached to a plate

Between Two Ferns: The Movie
Fern: a plant that has roots, stems, and fronds, but no flowers, and reproduces by means of spores

Bozo: an offensive term for somebody who says or does something unwise
Jet Ski: a trademark for a jet-propelled personal watercraft
Boa: a long fluffy scarf of feathers or fur worn by women around the neck
Pantyliner: a light thin sanitary napkin
Commode: toilet
Plenty: used to emphasize the degree to which something is the case
Harry: the smallest or weakest piglet in a litter
Smoosh: to squash or mash
EGOT: the achievement of having won all four of the major American entertainment awards (an Emmy, a Grammy, an Oscar, and a Tony)

Gusher: an oil well from which oil flows freely and in large amounts, without having to be pumped

Jitters: feelings of nervousness or agitation
Mace: a spice made from the covering of the nutmeg seed, used in the form of dried pieces or as a yellow-orange powder

## Queef: (of a woman) to release air audibly from the vagina

Unmoor: to free a ship or boat from its moorings, or be freed from moorings
Ding-dong: somebody considered as odd, irrational, silly, or lacking in intelligence

Clam: an invertebrate animal with a shell in two parts and a muscular foot used to burrow into sand

Bankroll: to provide the money needed to finance a project on a continuing basis

Disheveled: 1. with messed-up hair or clothes 2 . disordered and untidy
Blazer: a plain jacket not forming part of a suit but considered appropriate for formal wear

Toot: a high-pitched hooting sound such as that made by a vehicle's horn or a trumpet or flute

Steal: something that does not cost very much or that costs a lot less than would be expected

Washed-up: no longer likely to continue or succeed
Fudge: nonsensical talk
John Wick: Chapter 3 - Parabellum
Dilly-dally: to waste time by being too slow, doing nothing, or being unable to decide what to do

Concierge: somebody who is employed at a hotel or apartment building to help the guests or residents, e.g. by dealing with luggage, making travel arrangements, or delivering messages

Pirouette: a spin of the body, especially one performed in ballet on tiptoe or on the ball of one foot

Lifeboat: a boat used for rescuing people from ships in trouble at sea
Adjudicate: to make an official decision about a problem or dispute
Adjudge: to judge somebody or something in a particular way
Flyway: a traditional route taken by migrating birds

Deign: to do something in a way that shows that it is considered a great favor

Blowfish: a tropical ocean fish, poisonous in some species, that can inflate its body with water to appear larger to predators. Although poisonous, some varieties can be eaten as food after special preparation.

Deconsecrate: to convert a sacred place, building, or object to secular use
Fumigate: to treat something with fumes, or be treated with fumes, especially to kill microorganisms or pests

Grain: the smallest unit of weight in the avoirdupois (1/7000 pound) and apothecaries' systems ( $1 / 5760$ pound), equal to approximately 0.065 grams

Slug: a metal projectile that is fired from a gun or rifle
Parley: a round of talks or negotiations, especially between opposing military forces

Amuse-bouche=amuse-gueule: a small appetizer that is served before a main meal begins

To the quick: 1. to the exposed flesh, especially that which is tender 2. to the deepest, most fragile part of oneself. Typically used to describe emotional wounds.

Handful: somebody or something that is difficult to cope with or control

Rad: very good, desirable, admirable, or fashionable
Hut: used to mark time while marching

Poppycock: absurd speech or writing
Expiate: to make amends, show remorse, or suffer punishment for wrongdoing

Hopscotch: a children's game in which players hop along squares marked in a pattern on the ground to pick up a small object thrown into one of the squares

Take a hike: to leave abruptly, or, more often, used to tell somebody who is unwelcome to leave

Fudge: to fiddle with or otherwise alter something in order to deceive or remain noncommittal

Fecundity: 1. the ability to produce offspring, especially in large numbers 2. the ability to produce many different and original ideas

The wrong end of the stick: a misunderstanding, miscommunication, or distortion of the fact

Finicky: difficult to please, and tending to concentrate on small or unimportant details

Patty: 1. a small pie or pasty 2. a patty shell (a decorative edible shell of baked puff pastry that is filled with other food such as meat, fish, vegetables, or fruit)

Boon: a gift or favor from somebody
Tartar sauce: a mayonnaise mixed with capers and chopped pickles that is served as an accompaniment to fish

Fortitude: strength and endurance in a difficult or painful situation
Wherewithal: the money or resources required for a purpose
Grit: determination or strength of character
Gallantry: bravery, especially in war or in a situation of great danger
Moxie: courage combined with inventiveness
Wingman: a pilot who flies in a position behind, and to the side of, the leader of a flying formation

Drill down: to access data or information organized in hierarchical form by starting from general information and moving through increasingly detailed data

Hyperbole: deliberate and obvious exaggeration used for effect, e.g. "I could eat a million of these."

Tumbleweed: a densely branched plant such as the Russian thistle that grows in dry regions and in late summer withers and breaks from its roots to be blown about by the wind

Set out: to begin something, especially a journey
Lollygag: to waste time in a pleasant idle way
Toodle-oo: goodbye
Digress: to move away from the central topic or line of argument in speaking or writing, usually temporarily

Harpoon: to catch a whale or other large sea animal using a harpoon
Fickle: likely to change, especially in affections, intentions, loyalties, or preferences

Churro: a thick fritter made from a coil of dough
Sea urchin: a small marine invertebrate animal with a soft body enclosed in a spherical shell that is covered in spines when the animal is alive.

Jangle: to make a harsh metallic noise, or cause something made of metal to make such a noise

Rube: an offensive term for somebody who is regarded as naive or unsophisticated, especially somebody from a rural area who is not used to city ways

Halibut: a large flatfish. Native to: northern Atlantic, Pacific oceans.
Billow: 1. to fill with air, or cause something made of fabric to fill with air, and swell outward 2. to move upward or along in a curling or rolling mass

Cephalopod: an invertebrate ocean animal with a large head and tentacles, e.g. an octopus, squid, or cuttlefish

Teensy-weensy: teeny-weeny
Buck up: to become more cheerful, confident, or encouraged, or make somebody do this

Crappie: a freshwater sunfish with equal-sized anal and dorsal fins. Native to: lakes and ponds in North America.

Goner: somebody or something beyond hope of recovery, especially somebody who is dead or about to die

Hoot: a highly amusing person, object, or situation
Revile: 1. to make a fierce or abusive verbal attack on somebody or something 2. to use insulting or abusive language

Nabob: a rich or powerful person
Natter: to talk about not very serious matters, often rapidly and at length and sometimes in an irritating way

Luncheonette: a small fairly simple restaurant serving full lunch menus and snacks, and often breakfast

Parry: to block or deflect the damaging effect of a blow or weapon
Pirouette: a spin of the body, especially one performed in ballet on tiptoe or on the ball of one foot

Tsk tsk: used in writing to represent a sucking or clicking sound made to express disappointment, disgust, or sympathy
