Pilot

Spooky: 1) frightening or unnerving because suggesting the presence of supernatural forces 2) strange or amazing, often in a way that seems supernatural 3) easily frightened or startled

Deep Throat

Spud: 1) an informal word for potato 2) a narrow-bladed spade for cutting roots, digging up weeds, etc. 3) also called **spudder:** a tool, resembling a chisel, for removing bark from trees

Stripper: a device or substance for removing paint, varnish, etc.

Hooey: nonsense; rubbish

Concomitant: 1) existing or occurring together; associative 2) a concomitant act, person, etc.

Squeeze

Stakeout: 1) a police surveillance of an area, house, or criminal suspect 2) an area or house kept under such surveillance

Down to earth: with no illusions or pretensions; practical and realistic: *a down-to-earth view of marriage*

Finagle: 1) to get or achieve by trickery, craftiness, or persuasion; wangle 2) to use trickery or craftiness on (a person)

Snag: 1) catch or tear (something) on a sharp projection: thorns snagged his sweater ■ [no obj.] become caught on a sharp projection: radio aerials snagged on bushes and branches 2) catch or obtain: it's the first time they've snagged the star for a photo

Conduit

Bundt: a baking pan with a hollow, circular, raised area in the middle

Singe: 1) to burn or be burnt superficially; scorch: *to singe one's clothes* 2) to burn the ends of (hair, etc.) 3) to expose (a carcass) to flame to remove bristles or hair

Trailhead: the place where a trail begins

The Jersey Devil

Scat: an animal dropping

Hustle: 1) to shove or crowd (someone) roughly 2) to move or cause to move hurriedly or furtively: *he hustled her out of sight* 3) to deal with or cause to proceed hurriedly: *to hustle legislation through* 4) to earn or obtain (something) forcefully 5) (of procurers and prostitutes) to solicit 6) an instance of hustling 7) undue activity 8) a disco dance of the 1970s

Vagrant: 1) a person of no settled abode, income, or job; tramp 2) a migratory animal that is off course

Panhandle: to accost and beg from (passers-by), especially on the street

Spite: 1) maliciousness involving the desire to harm another; venomous ill will 2) an instance of such malice; grudge 3) to annoy in order to vent spite

Requisition: 1) a request or demand, especially an authoritative or formal one 2) an official form on which such a demand is made 3) the act of taking something over, especially temporarily for military or public use in time of emergency 4) a necessary or essential condition; requisite 5) a formal request by one government to another for the surrender of a fugitive from justice

Shadows

Soma: the body of an organism, especially an animal, as distinct from the germ cells

Knock oneself out: 1) (idiomatic) to go ahead; to do as one pleases 2) (idiomatic, in the imperative) to grant permission for or to give endorsement of a suggestion or proposal, especially when the speaker is not interested in its outcome. *I'm going to the store. / Knock yourself out.*

Ghost in the Machine

Mange: an infectious disorder mainly affecting domestic animals, characterized by itching, formation of papules and vesicles, and loss of hair: caused by parasitic mites

Egomaniac: egoist

Scruffy: unkempt or shabby

Kook: an eccentric, crazy, or foolish person

Obviate: to do away with or counter

Thumb one's nose at: to deride or mock, especially by placing the thumb on the nose with fingers extended

Acquisitive: inclined or eager to acquire things, especially material possessions

Resolve: firmness of purpose; determination: nothing can break his resolve

Exonerate: 1) to clear or absolve from blame or a criminal charge 2) to relieve from an obligation or task; exempt

Consign: 1) to hand over or give into the care or charge of another; entrust 2) to commit irrevocably: *he consigned the papers to the flames* 3) to commit for admittance: *to consign someone to jail* 4) to address or deliver (goods) for sale, disposal, etc.: *it was consigned to his London address* 5) to assent; agree

Ice

Mitten: 1) a glove having one section for the thumb and a single section for the other fingers. Sometimes shortened to: mitt 2) a boxing glove

Credentials: a letter or certificate giving evidence of the bearer's identity or competence

Keg: a small barrel used for storing liquids

Scolex: the head of a tapeworm, with suckers or hooks that enable the parasitic worm to attach itself to its host

Wired: full of nervous energy or excitement

Sweltering: oppressively hot

Space

Cloak-and-dagger: involving secrecy or intrigue, often as part of an espionage operation

Crucible: 1) a vessel in which substances are heated to high temperatures 2) the hearth at the bottom of a metallurgical furnace in which the metal collects 3) a severe trial or test

Specious: 1) apparently correct or true, but actually wrong or false 2) deceptively attractive in appearance

Payload: 1) that part of a cargo earning revenue 2) a) the passengers, cargo, or bombs carried by an aircraft b) the equipment carried by a rocket, satellite, or spacecraft 3) the explosive power of a warhead, bomb, etc., carried by a missile or aircraft: *a missile carrying a 50-megaton payload*

Grotesque: 1) strangely or fantastically distorted; bizarre: a grotesque reflection in the mirror 2) of or characteristic of the grotesque in art 3) absurdly incongruous; in a ludicrous context: a grotesque turn of phrase

Telemetry: 1) the use of radio waves, telephone lines, etc., to transmit the readings of measuring instruments to a device on which the readings can be indicated or recorded 2) the measurement of linear distance using a tellurometer

So much for: a) no more can or need be said about b) used to express contempt for something that has failed: *so much for your bright idea*

Fallen Angel

Bogey: 1) an evil or mischievous spirit 2) something that worries or annoys

Intrepid: fearless; daring; bold

Flexion: 1) the act of bending a joint or limb 2) the condition of the joint or limb so bent

Residency: the period, following internship, during which a physician undergoes further clinical training, usually in one medical speciality

Inquest: 1) an inquiry into the cause of an unexplained, sudden, or violent death, or as to whether or not property constitutes treasure trove, held by a coroner, in certain cases with a jury 2) any inquiry or investigation

Waterfront: the area of a town or city alongside a body of water, such as a harbor or dockyard

Gallows: a frame for hanging criminals

 $\textbf{Countermand: 1) to revoke or cancel (a command, order, etc.) 2) to order (forces, etc.) to return or retreat; recall$

Eve

Hypovolemia: a state of decreased blood volume

Jugular, jugular vein: any of three large veins of the neck that return blood to the heart from the head and face

Digitalis: 1) a drug containing glycoside, prepared from dried foxglove leaves. Use: heart stimulant. 2) a plant such as the foxglove. Native to: Europe, Asia.

Exsanguinate: to drain the blood from

Even money: equally likely or unlikely

In vitro: (of biological processes or reactions) made to occur outside the living organism in an artificial environment, such as a culture medium

Censure: to criticize (someone or something) severely; condemn

Sleep on it: to give (something) extended consideration, especially overnight

Foxglove: a tall plant that is the source of the drug digitalis. Flowers: purple or white, thimble-shaped.

Fire

Plastique or **plastic explosive:** an explosive with the consistency of putty that allows it to be easily molded

Stake: a thin wooden or metal post that is driven into the ground to mark or support something

Extraneous: 1) not essential 2) not pertinent or applicable; irrelevant 3) coming from without; of external origin 4) not belonging; unrelated to that to which it is added or in which it is contained

Accelerant: a substance that is used to intensify a fire

Dusting: 1) a thin, sometimes patchy covering of a powdery substance: *a dusting of snow on the ground* 2) a defeat or setback: *a candidate who took a real dusting at the polls*

Aliphatic: (of an organic compound) not aromatic, especially having an open chain structure, such as alkanes, alkenes, and alkynes

Pyrolysis: 1) the application of heat to chemical compounds in order to cause decomposition 2) chemical decomposition of compounds caused by high temperatures

Exothermic: (of a chemical reaction or compound) occurring or formed with the evolution of heat

Caretaker: 1) a person who is in charge of a place or thing, especially in the owner's absence: *the caretaker of a school* 2) (modifier) holding office temporarily; interim: *a caretaker government* 3) a person who takes care of a vulnerable person, often a close relative

Cur: 1) any vicious dog, especially a mongrel 2) a despicable or cowardly person

Extraordinaire: excellent or outstanding (used after nouns): a piano player extraordinaire

Bum: to get something by asking or begging

Lozenge: a medicated tablet held in the mouth until it has dissolved

Composite: an image of a suspect's face that is created by a police artist or photographer, based on input from witnesses

Deftly: in a deft manner; quickly and neatly in action

Cheap shot: an unfair or malicious attack on somebody or something, either in print or in speech

Dredge up: 1) to bring to notice, especially with considerable effort and from an obscure, remote, or unlikely source: to dredge up worthless ideas 2) to raise with or as if with a dredge: they dredged up the corpse from the lake

Maladjustment: 1) a failure to meet the demands of society, such as coping with problems and social relationships: usually reflected in emotional instability 2) faulty or bad adjustment

Discreet: careful to avoid social embarrassment or distress, especially by keeping confidences secret; tactful

Have one's hands full: a) to be completely occupied b) to be beset with problems

Edification: 1) improvement, instruction, or enlightenment, especially when morally or spiritually uplifting 2) the act of edifying or state of being edified

Dole: money received from the state while out of work

Tenement: 1) also called **tenement building:** (now especially in Scotland) a large building divided into separate flats 2) a dwelling place or residence, especially one intended for rent 3) a room or flat for rent 4) any form of permanent property, such as land, dwellings, offices, etc.

Beyond the Sea

Shove off: (often imperative) 1) to move from the shore in a boat 2) to go away; depart

Coronary: a heart attack

Stay: something that acts to stop or delay something negative happening

Strangle: to kill by compressing the windpipe; throttle

Twine: a string

Femur: the longest thickest bone of the human skeleton, articulating with the pelvis above and the knee below; a thighbone

Palpate: to examine (an area of the body) by the sense of touch and pressure

Gurney: a wheeled stretcher for transporting hospital patients

Vat: a large container for holding or storing liquids

Gender Bender

Chippy=chippie: a promiscuous young woman, especially a prostitute

Egress: 1) the action of going out of or leaving a place: *direct means of access and egress for passengers* ■ [count noun] a way out: *a narrow egress*

Pheromone: a chemical substance produced and released into the environment by an animal, especially a mammal or an insect, affecting the behavior or physiology of others of its species

Aphrodisiac: 1) a drug, food, etc., that excites sexual desire 2) exciting or heightening sexual desire

Admonish: 1) to reprove firmly but not harshly 2) to advise to do or against doing something; warn; caution

Look-see: a brief inspection or look

Whinny: a gentle, high-pitched neigh

Transvestite: a person who seeks sexual pleasure from wearing clothes that are normally associated with the opposite sex

Lazarus

Cursive: 1) written with the characters joined: *cursive script* 2) [mass noun] cursive writing

Operatic: relating to or characteristic of opera: *operatic arias* ■ extravagantly theatrical; histrionic: *she wrung her hands in operatic despair*

Squelch: make a soft sucking sound such as that made by walking heavily through mud: bedraggled guests squelched across the lawn to seek shelter forcefully silence or suppress: property developers tried to squelch public protest

Young at Heart

Waybill: a document attached to goods in transit specifying their nature, point of origin, and destination as well as the route to be taken and the rate to be charged

Coop: cage

Ascenders and descenders:



Haiku: an epigrammatic Japanese verse form in 17 syllables

Point-blank: 1) a) aimed or fired at a target so close that it is unnecessary to make allowance for the drop in the course of the projectile b) permitting such aim or fire without loss of accuracy: *at point-blank range* 2) plain or blunt: *a point-blank question*

Spite: ill-will

Infirmary: a place for the treatment of the sick or injured; dispensary; hospital

Hip: 1) very fashionable: *it's hip to be environmentally conscious* 2) aware of or informed about: *he's trying to show how hip he is to Americana*

Prosthesis: a) the replacement of a missing bodily part with an artificial substitute b) an artificial part such as a limb, eye, or tooth

Myelin: a mixture of proteins and phospholipids forming a whitish insulating sheath around many nerve fibers, which increases the speed at which impulses are conducted

Knoll: a small hill or mound

Miracle Man

Penance: if you do penance for something wrong that you have done, you do something that you find unpleasant to show that you are sorry: *a time of*

fasting, penance and pilgrimage. The Koran recommends fasting as a penance before pilgrimages.

Recognizance: a bond by which a person undertakes before a court or magistrate to observe some condition, especially to appear when summoned

Pulpit: a raised enclosed platform in a church or chapel from which the preacher delivers a sermon • (the pulpit) religious teaching as expressed in sermons: the movies could rival the pulpit as an agency moulding the ideas of the mass public

Smorgasbord: a range of open sandwiches and delicacies served as hors d'oeuvres or a buffet ■ a wide range of something; a variety: *the album is a smorgasbord of different musical styles*

Paraplegia: paralysis of the legs and lower body, typically caused by spinal injury or disease

Pinprick: a prick caused by a pin ■ a cause of minor irritation

Gaping: (of a hole, wound, etc.) wide open: there was a gaping hole in the wall

Embolism: obstruction of an artery, typically by a clot of blood or an air bubble

Hypoxia: deficiency in the amount of oxygen reaching the tissues

Sodium: Na
Potassium: K

Arsenic: As

Sacrilege: 1) the misuse or desecration of anything regarded as sacred or as worthy of extreme respect: *to play Mozart's music on a kazoo is sacrilege* 2) the act or an instance of taking anything sacred for secular use

Jailer: a person in charge of a jail or of the prisoners in it

Hew: 1) [with obj.] chop or cut (something, especially wood or coal) with an axe, pick, or other tool ■ make or shape by cutting a hard material such as wood: *a seat hewn out of a fallen tree trunk* 2) [no obj.] (hew to) conform or adhere to: *his administration would hew to high ethical standards*

Tarnation: a euphemism for damnation

Ravening: (of a ferocious wild animal) extremely hungry and hunting for prey: *they turned on each other like ravening wolves*

Delirious: in an acutely disturbed state of mind characterized by restlessness, illusions, and incoherence; affected by delirium ■ in a state of wild excitement or ecstasy: there was a great roar from the delirious crowd

Shapes

Corral: 1) an enclosure for confining cattle or horses 2) (formerly) a defensive enclosure formed by a ring of covered wagons

Cuspid: a tooth with a single cusp or point; a canine tooth

Lycanthropy: 1) the supposed magical transformation of a person into a wolf 2) a delusion in which a person believes that he is a wolf

Bourbon: a kind of American whisky distilled from maize and rye

Darkness Falls

(Make a) run for it: attempt to escape someone or something by running away

Monkey wrench: sabotage (something), especially as a form of protest

Ecoterrorist: a person who uses violence in order to achieve environmentalist aims

Condone: 1) to overlook or forgive (an offence) 2) law (especially of a spouse) to pardon or overlook (an offence, usually adultery)

Sapling: 1) a young tree 2) literary a youth

Cocoon: 1) a silky case spun by the larvae of many insects for protection as pupae ■ something that envelops someone in a protective or comforting way: *a cocoon of bedclothes*

Desiccate: 1) remove the moisture from (something), typically in order to preserve it: *desiccated coconut* 2) (as adj. desiccated) lacking interest, passion, or energy: *a desiccated history of ideas*

Itsy-bitsy or itty-bitty: very small; tiny

Borer: 1) a worm, mollusk, insect, or insect larva that bores into wood, other plant material, or rock 2) a tool for boring

Sanctimonious: affecting piety or making a display of holiness

Luciferin: a substance occurring in bioluminescent organisms, such as glow-worms and fireflies. It undergoes an enzyme-catalysed oxidation and emits light on decaying to its ground state

Tooms

Untenable: (especially of a position or view) not able to be maintained or defended against attack or objection

Saving grace: [mass noun] the redeeming grace of God ■ [count noun] a redeeming quality or characteristic

Elkhound: a large hunting dog of a Scandinavian breed with a shaggy gray

Inordinate: 1) unusually or disproportionately large; excessive: *the case had taken up an inordinate amount of time* 2) (of a person) unrestrained in feelings or behavior

Liverwurst: a seasoned meat paste in the form of a sausage containing cooked liver, or a mixture of liver and pork

Born Again

Eel: a snakelike fish with a slender elongated body and poorly developed fins, proverbial for its slipperiness

Shrink: a slang word for psychiatrist

Sternum: the breastbone

Necrosis: 1) the death of one or more cells in the body, usually within a localized area, as from an interruption of the blood supply to that part 2) death of plant tissue due to disease, frost, etc.

Gangland: [mass noun] the world of criminal gangs [as modifier] he was the victim of a gangland killing

Smack: heroin

Brush-off: an abrupt dismissal or rejection

Actionable: 1) giving sufficient reason to take legal action: an actionable assertion 2) able to be done or acted on; having practical value: insightful and actionable information on the effect advertising is having on your brand

Wanting: deficient in intelligence

Windup: an act of concluding or finishing something: the windup of the convention

Bradycardia: abnormally slow heart action

Hey presto=presto: *exclamation* a phrase announcing the successful completion of a trick, or to suggest that something has been done so easily that it seems to be magic: *press the start button and, hey presto, a copy comes out the other end*

Roland

Zilch: nothing

Savant: a learned person, especially a distinguished scientist

Funk: avoid (a task or thing) out of fear

Egghead: informal, often derogatory a person who is highly academic or studious; an intellectual

Widow's peak: a V-shaped growth of hair toward the center of the forehead, especially one left by a receding hairline in a man

Volition: choosing

The Erlenmeyer Flask

Erlenmeyer flask: a conical flat-bottomed laboratory flask with a narrow neck

Peridotite: a dense, coarse-grained plutonic rock containing a large amount of olivine, believed to be the main constituent of the earth's mantle

Caduceus: 1) *classical mythology* a staff entwined with two serpents and bearing a pair of wings at the top, carried by Hermes (Mercury) as messenger of the gods 2) an insignia resembling this staff used as an emblem of the medical profession

Deep throat: a person who anonymously supplies information about covert or illegal action in the organization where they work

Dyspnea: difficult or labored breathing

Cannula: a thin tube inserted into a vein or body cavity to administer medication, drain off fluid, or insert a surgical instrument

Nucleotide: a compound consisting of a nucleoside linked to a phosphate group. Nucleotides form the basic structural unit of nucleic acids such as DNA.

Smokescreen: a cloud of smoke created to conceal military operations ■ a ruse designed to disguise someone's real intentions or activities

Wellspring: 1) the source of a spring or stream; fountainhead 2) a source of continual or abundant supply

Little Green Men

Rigor mortis: stiffening of the joints and muscles of a body a few hours after death, usually lasting from one to four days

Degauss: 1) to neutralize the magnetic field of a ship's hull (as a protection against magnetic mines) using equipment producing an opposing magnetic field 2) another word for *demagnetize*

The Host

Rub someone's nose in it: to remind someone unkindly of his failing or

In extremis: in an extremely difficult situation ■ at the point of death

Nodule: a small swelling or aggregation of cells in the body, especially an abnormal one

Tetanus: a bacterial disease marked by rigidity and spasms of the voluntary muscles

Fluke: flatworm

Sirloin: a piece of beef which is cut from the bottom and side parts of a cow's back

Endoparasite: a parasite, such as the tapeworm, that lives within the body of its host

Catacomb: an underground cemetery consisting of a subterranean gallery with recesses for tombs, as constructed by the ancient Romans

Runt: a small pig or other animal, especially the smallest in a litter ■ an undersized or weak person

Vestigial: forming a very small remnant of something that was once much larger or more noticeable: he felt a vestigial flicker of anger from last night

Bupkis=bupkes: nothing at all

Reek: stink

Primordial: 1) existing at or from the beginning; earliest; primeval 2) constituting an origin; fundamental 3) *biology* of or relating to an early stage of development: *primordial germ cells*

Blood

Adrenal: relating to or denoting a pair of ductless glands situated above the kidneys. Each consists of a core region (adrenal medulla) secreting adrenalin and noradrenaline, and an outer region (adrenal cortex) secreting corticosteroids

Lysergic acid: a crystalline compound prepared from natural ergot alkaloids or synthetically, from which the drug LSD (lysergic acid diethylamide) can be made

Electroencephalograph: an instrument for recording the electrical activity of the brain, usually by means of electrodes placed on the scalp: used to diagnose tumors of the brain, to study brain waves, etc. Abbreviation: EEG

Sleepless

Atrioventricular: relating to the atrial and ventricular chambers of the heart, or the connection or coordination between them

Occipital: of or relating to the back of the head or skull

Pugilism: the profession or hobby of boxing: *I do not go to displays of pugilism.*

Extradural=epidural: in or around the dura mater, in particular (of an anaesthetic) introduced into the space around the dura mater of the spinal cord

Baguette: 1) a long, narrow French loaf 2) [often as modifier] a gem, especially a diamond, cut in a long rectangular shape: *a baguette diamond*

Iniquity: immoral or grossly unfair behavior: a den of iniquity

Circadian: (of biological processes) recurring naturally on a twenty-four-hour cycle, even in the absence of light fluctuations: *a circadian rhythm*

Antsy: agitated, impatient, or restless

Serotonin: a compound present in blood platelets and serum, which constricts the blood vessels and acts as a neurotransmitter

Surmise: suppose that something is true without having evidence to confirm it: *he surmised that something must be wrong*

AWOL: an abbreviation for 'absent without leave'. If someone in the Armed Forces goes AWOL, they leave their post without the permission of a superior officer. The troops went AWOL to express their complaints about the camp.

Duane Barry

Lucid: expressed clearly; easy to understand: *a lucid account; write in a clear and lucid style* ■ showing ability to think clearly, especially in the intervals between periods of confusion or insanity: *he has a few lucid moments every now and then*

Ambient: relating to the immediate surroundings of something: *the liquid is stored at below ambient temperature*

Medulla oblongata: the continuation of the spinal cord within the skull, forming the lowest part of the brainstem and containing control centers for the heart and lungs

Ascension

Cog: a wheel with square or triangular teeth around the edge, which is used in a machine to turn another wheel or part.

Doze off: fall asleep

Asphyxiation: suffocation, smothering

Hypoxemia: an abnormally low concentration of oxygen in the blood

Etiology: the etiology of a disease or a problem is the study of its cause: *the etiology of psychiatric disorder*

Recourse: having to use something or ask somebody for help in a difficult situation: *She made a complete recovery without recourse to surgery.*

Suborn: bribe or otherwise induce (someone) to commit an unlawful act such as perjury: he was accused of conspiring to suborn witnesses

Edema: a condition characterized by an excess of watery fluid collecting in the cavities or tissues of the body

Porphyria: a rare hereditary disease in which there is abnormal metabolism of the blood pigment hemoglobin. Porphyrins are excreted in the urine, which becomes dark; other symptoms include mental disturbances and extreme sensitivity of the skin to light

Cutaneous: relating to or affecting the skin

One Breath

Irrevocable: not able to be changed, reversed, or recovered; final: an irrevocable step

Firewalker

Come to blows: start fighting after a disagreement

Beauteous: beautiful

Caldera: a large volcanic crater, especially one formed by a major eruption leading to the collapse of the mouth of the volcano

Porous: spongy

Obsidian: a hard, dark, glass-like volcanic rock formed by the rapid solidification of lava without crystallization

Pulverize: reduce to fine particles

Red Museum

Toil: hard or exhausting work

Transcendent: 1) exceeding or surpassing in degree or excellence 2) a) (in the philosophy of Kant) beyond or before experience; a priori b) (of a concept) falling outside a given set of categories c) beyond consciousness or direct apprehension 3) (of God) having continuous existence outside the created world 4) free from the limitations inherent in matter 5) a transcendent thing

Subscribe to: to give support or approval: to subscribe to the theory of transubstantiation

Posse: short for **posse comitatus**, the able-bodied men of a district assembled together and forming a group upon whom the sheriff may call for assistance in maintaining law and order

Pen: an enclosure in which domestic animals are kept: sheep pen

Fracas: a noisy quarrel; brawl

Vial=phial: a small bottle for liquids

Excelsis Dei

Get off: to become high on or as on heroin or some other drug

Convalescent: a patient who is recovering from an illness or the effects of medical treatment

Not give a rat's ass: to not care at all: Frankly, I don't give a rat's ass about her.

Fibrillation: 1) a local and uncontrollable twitching of muscle fibres, especially of the heart, not affecting the entire muscle. Atrial fibrillation results in rapid and irregular heart and pulse rate. In ventricular fibrillation, the heart stops beating 2) irregular twitchings of the muscular wall of the heart, often interfering with the normal rhythmic contractions

Lidocaine: a powerful local anesthetic administered by injection, or topically to mucous membranes

Epinephrine: adrenaline

Cyanosis: a bluish-purple discoloration of skin and mucous membranes usually resulting from a deficiency of oxygen in the blood

Acetylcholine: a chemical substance secreted at the ends of many nerve fibers, especially in the autonomic nervous system, and responsible for the transmission of nervous impulses

Goose egg: zero

Cholinergic: 1) denoting nerve fibers that release acetylcholine when stimulated 2) of or relating to the type of chemical activity associated with acetylcholine and similar substances

Hematoma: a tumor of clotted or partially clotted blood

Orderly: a male hospital attendant

Atropine: a poisonous alkaloid obtained from deadly nightshade, having an inhibitory action on the autonomic nervous system. It is used medicinally in pre-anaesthetic medication, to speed a slow heart rate, and as an emergency first-aid counter to exposure to chemical warfare nerve agents

Remand: (of a court or magistrate) to send (a prisoner or accused person) back into custody or admit him to bail, especially on adjourning a case for further inquiries to be made

Aubrey

Occlusal: relating to the biting surface of a molar or premolar tooth

Bicuspid: having or terminating in two cusps or points

Cryptomnesia: the reappearance of a suppressed or forgotten memory which is mistaken for a new experience

Stigma (pl. stigmata): marks resembling the wounds of the crucified Christ, believed to appear on the bodies of certain individuals

APB (All Points Bulletin): a broadcast issued from one American law enforcement agency to another. It typically contains information about a wanted suspect who is to be arrested or a person of interest, for whom law enforcement officers are to look. They are usually dangerous or missing persons.

Amnio=Amniocentesis: removal of some amniotic fluid by the insertion into the womb of a hollow needle, for therapeutic or diagnostic purposes

Irresistible

Pepper shaker=pepperpot: a small container with holes in the top, used for shaking pepper onto food

Pinking shears: scissors with a serrated edge on one or both blades, producing a wavy edge to material cut, thus preventing fraying

Die Hand Die Verletzt

Infernal: 1) of or relating to an underworld of the dead 2) deserving hell or befitting its occupants; diabolic; fiendish 3) *informal* irritating; confounded

Shellac: a yellowish resin secreted by the lac insect, especially a commercial preparation of this used in varnishes, polishes, and leather dressings

Rattle: to disconcert; make frightened or anxious

Portent: 1) a sign or indication of a future event, especially a momentous or calamitous one; omen 2) momentous or ominous significance: a cry of dire portent 3) a miraculous occurrence; marvel

Formaldehyde: a colorless poisonous irritating gas with a pungent characteristic odor, made by the oxidation of methanol and used as formalin and in the manufacture of synthetic resins.

Fasciitis: inflammation of the fascia of a muscle

Fresh Bones

Peony: 1) any of various ranunculaceous shrubs and plants of the genus Paeonia, of Eurasia and North America, having large pink, red, white, or yellow flowers 2) the flower of any of these plants

Tetrodotoxin: a highly lethal neurotoxin found in certain puffer fish and in newts of the genus Taricha

Potion: 1) a drink, especially of medicine, poison, or some supposedly magic beverage 2) a rare word for beverage

Apprise: to inform somebody

Colony

Hit the roof: a) to get extremely angry; become furious b) to rise or increase steeply

Polycythaemia: [mass noun] an abnormally increased concentration of hemoglobin in the blood, either through reduction of plasma volume or increase in red cell numbers. It may be a primary disease of unknown cause,

or a secondary condition linked to respiratory or circulatory disorder or cancer

Curdle: separate or cause to separate into curds or lumps: *take care not to let the soup boil or it will curdle*

End Game

Digoxin: a poisonous compound present in the foxglove and other plants. It is a steroid glycoside and is used in small doses as a cardiac stimulant.

Heparin: a compound occurring in the liver and other tissues which inhibits blood coagulation. A sulphur-containing polysaccharide, it is used as an anticoagulant in the treatment of thrombosis

Recon=Reconnaissance: [C, U] the study of a place or area for military reasons: *The plane was shot down while on a reconnaissance mission over enemy territory.*

Fearful Symmetry

Field day: a day or time of exciting or successful activity: *the children had a field day with their new toys*

Craven: cowardly; mean-spirited

Unabashed: not ashamed, embarrassed, or ill at ease

Hypolasia: incomplete development of an organ or part

Corpus luteum: a yellow glandular mass of tissue that forms in a Graafian follicle following release of an ovum. It secretes progesterone, a hormone necessary to maintain pregnancy

Cattle prod: a hand-held electrified rod with low voltage used to control cattle

Pall: a depressing or oppressive atmosphere: her bereavement cast a pall on the party

Død Kalm

Cast off: (of a boat or ship) be set free from its moorings: the ferry cast off and made a beeline for the pier

Trawler: 1) a fishing boat that uses a trawl net or dragnet to catch fish. 2) a fisherman who uses a trawl net.

Beluga: a small white toothed whale related to the narwhal, living in herds mainly in Arctic coastal waters. Also called **white whale.**

Senescence: the condition or process of deterioration with age ■ loss of a cell's power of division and growth

Humbug

Ichthyosis: a congenital skin condition which causes the epidermis to become dry and horny like fish scales

Wake: a watch or vigil held beside the body of someone who has died, sometimes accompanied by ritual observances

Rube: a country bumpkin

Rinky-dink: old-fashioned, amateurish, or shoddy

Tabernacle: a church used by certain Christian Protestant groups and by Mormons

Humbug: 1) a person or thing that tricks or deceives 2) nonsense; rubbish

Hawk: carry about and offer (goods) for sale, typically advertising them by shouting: *street traders were hawking costume jewellery*

Simian: relating to or affecting apes or monkeys

Big top: informal 1) the main tent of a circus 2) the circus itself

Dour: relentlessly severe, stern, or gloomy in manner or appearance

Blockhead: a very stupid person

Lobotomy: a surgical operation involving incision into the prefrontal lobe of the brain, formerly used to treat mental illness

Yogi: a person who is proficient in yoga

Swami: a Hindu male religious teacher

Gaff: to cheat; hoax

Vicarious: 1) experienced in the imagination through the feelings or actions of another person: *this catalogue brings vicarious pleasure in luxury living* 2) acting or done for another: *a vicarious atonement*

Lanky: (of a person) ungracefully thin and tall

Feral: savage

Nondescript: lacking distinctive or interesting features or characteristics

Hypertrichosis: excessive growth of hair

Futon: a padded unsprung mattress originating in Japan, that can be rolled up or folded in two

Cirrhosis: a chronic disease of the liver marked by degeneration of cells, inflammation, and fibrous thickening of tissue. It is typically a result of alcoholism or hepatitis

Lay off: give up or stop doing something: I laid off smoking for seven years

The Calusari

Gammadion: a decorative figure composed of a number of Greek capital gammas, especially radiating from a centre, as in a swastika

Fylfot: a swastika

Munchausen's syndrome: a mental disorder in which a person repeatedly feigns severe illness so as to obtain hospital treatment ■ Munchausen's syndrome by proxy: a mental disorder in which a person seeks attention by inducing or feigning illness in another person, typically a child

Dote on: love dearly

Apport: a material object produced supposedly by occult means, especially at a séance

Bilocation: the supposed phenomenon of being in two places simultaneously

Mugwork: a plant of the daisy family, with aromatic divided leaves that are dark green above and whitish below, native to north temperate regions

F. Emasculata

Crib: a person's apartment or house

Basal: forming or belonging to a bottom layer or base

Decon: decontamination

Crack: a sharp blow, especially one that makes a noise

Parasitoid: an insect whose larvae live as parasites which eventually kill their hosts, e.g. an ichneumon wasp

Pustule: a small blister or pimple on the skin containing pus

Soft Light

At first blush: when first seen; as a first impression

Prophylactic: 1) protecting from or preventing disease 2) protective or preventive 3) a prophylactic drug or device, especially a condom

Maglev: a transport system in which trains glide above a track, supported by magnetic repulsion and propelled by a linear moto

Neutrino: a neutral subatomic particle with a mass close to zero and half-integral spin, which rarely reacts with normal matter. Three kinds of neutrinos are known, associated with the electron, muon, and tau particle

Gluon: a hypothetical massless subatomic particle believed to transmit the force binding quarks together in a hadron

Meson: a subatomic particle which is intermediate in mass between an electron and a proton and transmits the strong interaction that binds nucleons together in the atomic nucleus

Quark: any of a number of subatomic particles carrying a fractional electric charge, postulated as building blocks of the hadrons. Quarks have not been directly observed but theoretical predictions based on their existence have been confirmed experimentally

(Someone's) beck and call: ready to obey (someone's) orders instantly; subject to (someone's) slightest whim

Our Town

Foxfire: a luminescent glow emitted by certain fungi on rotting wood

When push comes to shove: when matters become critical; when a decision needs to be made

Fool's errand: a fruitless undertaking

Layabout: a lazy person; loafer

Prion: a protein in the brain, an abnormal form of which is thought to be the transmissable agent responsible for certain spongiform encephalopathies, such as BSE, scrapie, Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease, and kuru

Blow over: 1) to cease or be finished: *the storm blew over* 2) to be forgotten: *the scandal will blow over*

Anasazi

Snoop: a person who pries into the business of others

Shag: 1) a matted tangle, especially of hair, wool, etc. 2) a napped fabric, usually a rough wool 3) shredded coarse tobacco

Double talk: 1) rapid speech with a mixture of nonsense syllables and real words; gibberish 2) empty, deceptive, or ambiguous talk, especially by politicians

Stake: the method of execution in which somebody was tied to a post and burned

Slug: a bullet or pellet larger than a pellet of buckshot

Dialysis: the separation of small molecules from large molecules and colloids in a solution by the selective diffusion of the small molecules through a semipermeable membrane

The Blessing Way

Buzzard: 1) any diurnal bird of prey of the genus Buteo, typically having broad wings and tail and a soaring flight: family Accipitridae (hawks, etc.) 2) a mean or cantankerous person

Botulism: severe poisoning from ingestion of botulin, which affects the central nervous system producing difficulty in swallowing, visual disturbances, and respiratory paralysis: often fatal

Pucker (up): to gather or contract (a soft surface such as the skin of the face) into wrinkles or folds, or (of such a surface) to be so gathered or contracted

Whiz: an act of urinating

Pinhead: 1) the head of a pin 2) something very small 3) *informal* a stupid or contemptible person

Squat=diddly-squat: pronoun [usu. with negative] anything: *Hiram didn't care diddly-squat about what Darrel thought.*

Fulgurite: vitreous material formed of sand or other sediment fused by lightning ■ [count noun] a piece of fulgurite

Cherub: a winged angelic being described in biblical tradition as attending on God, represented in ancient Middle Eastern art as a lion or bull with eagles' wings and a human face and regarded in traditional Christian angelology as an angel of the second highest order of the ninefold celestial hierarchy

Thready: (of a sound, especially the voice) scarcely audible: *he managed a thready whisper* ■ (of a person's pulse) scarcely perceptible

Hypokalemia: deficiency of potassium in the bloodstream

Clyde Bruckman's Final Repose

Repose: 1) a state of quiet restfulness; peace or tranquility 2) dignified calmness of manner; composure

Malt: cereal grain, such as barley, that is kiln-dried after it has germinated by soaking in water

Entrails: 1) the internal organs of a person or animal; intestines; guts 2) the innermost parts of anything

To divine: to guess

Vivisection: the act or practice of performing experiments on living animals, involving cutting into or dissecting the body

Prognosticator: someone who predicts the future

Stupendous: astounding, wonderful, huge, etc.

Cockamamie: ridiculous or nonsensical: a cockamamie story

Lance=lancet: a small, broad two-edged surgical knife or blade with a sharp point

Instigate: 1) to bring about, as by incitement or urging: *to instigate rebellion* 2) to urge on to some drastic or inadvisable action

Meringue: an item of sweet food made from a mixture of egg whites and sugar baked until crisp: *chocolate meringues*

Doily: small ornamental mat made of lace or paper with a lace pattern, put on a plate under cakes or other sweet food

Contrive: create or bring about (an object or a situation) by deliberate use of skill and artifice: *his opponents contrived a cabinet crisis*

Putridity: 1) (of organic matter) in a state of decomposition, usually giving off a foul smell: *putrid meat* 2) morally corrupt or worthless 3) sickening; foul: *a putrid smell* 4) deficient in quality or value: *a putrid film*

Liquescent: becoming or apt to become liquid

Tarot: 1) one of a special pack of cards, now used mainly for fortune-telling, consisting of 78 cards (4 suits of 14 cards each (the minor arcana), and 22 other cards (the major arcana)) 2) a card in a tarot pack with distinctive symbolic design, such as the Wheel of Fortune

Happenstance: 1) chance 2) a chance occurrence

Altogether: 1) with everything included: *altogether he owed me sixty pounds* 2) completely; utterly; totally: *he was altogether mad* 3) on the whole: *altogether it was a very good party*

Anaerobic: relating to or requiring an absence of free oxygen: *anaerobic bacteria*

Shiv: a knife or razor used as a weapon

Catechism: a summary of the principles of Christian religion in the form of questions and answers, used for religious instruction ■ (in Roman Catholic use) religious instruction in general ■ a series of fixed questions, answers, or precepts used for instruction

Sway: rule; control: the country was under the sway of rival warlords

Mojo: a magic charm, talisman, or spell: *someone must have their mojo working over at the record company* ■ [mass noun] influence, especially magic power

Call off the dogs: to stop attacking or criticizing someone: The bank has agreed to call off the dogs until we can get the business up and running again.

Overture: (often plural) a proposal, act, or gesture initiating a relationship, negotiation, etc.

Shack up: to live or take up residence, especially with a mistress or lover

2Shy

Homebody: a person who likes to stay at home, especially one who is perceived as unadventurous

Dopey: stupefied by sleep or a drug: *she was under sedation and a bit dopey* ■ idiotic

Cock-a-doodle-doo: an imitation or representation of a cock crowing

Handyman: a person able or employed to do occasional domestic repairs and minor renovations

Metacarpal: any of the five bones of the hand ■ any of the bones in an animal's forelimb equivalent to the metacarpals

Mucosa: a mucous membrane: the intestinal mucosa

Autolysis: the destruction of cells or tissues by their own enzymes, especially those released by lysosomes

Adipose: (especially of body tissue) used for the storage of fat

Jibe: to agree; accord; harmonize

Aftershave: a liquid applied after shaving to soothe and scent the skin of the

Divvy up: divide something to share

Steeple: a church tower and spire ■ a spire on the top of a church tower or roof ■ a tall tower of a church or other building

The Walk

Stand at attention: to stand silently with the body stiff and straight, the feet together, and both arms at the sides

Crip: a disabled person

Turret: a small tower on top of a larger tower or at the corner of a building or wall, typically of a castle ■ a low armored tower, typically one that revolves, for a gun and gunners in a ship, aircraft, fort, or tank ■ a rotating holder for tools, especially on a lathe

Germane: (postpositive; usually followed by *to*) related (to the topic being considered); akin; relevant: *an idea germane to the conversation*

Inter: to place (a body) in the earth; bury, especially with funeral rites

Oubliette: a dungeon the only entrance to which is through the top

Glossolalia: 1) another term for gift of tongues 2) babbling in a nonexistent language

Big on: enthusiastic about: that company is big on research

Wacko: 1) mad or eccentric 2) a mad or eccentric person

Nisei

Nisei: a native-born citizen of the United States or Canada whose parents were Japanese immigrants

Hokey: (hokier, hokiest) sentimental: *a hokey tear-jerker* ■ noticeably contrived: *a hokey country-western accent*

Put (out) to sea: to embark on a sea voyage

Pallet: a portable platform on which goods can be moved, stacked, and stored, especially with the aid of a forklift

Pitchfork: a long-handled fork with two or three long curved tines for lifting, turning, or tossing hay

Livid: 1) (of the skin) discoloured, as from a bruise or contusion 2) of a greyish tinge or colour: *livid pink* 3) angry or furious

Hagiography: 1) the writing of the lives of the saints 2) biography of the saints 3) any biography that idealizes or idolizes its subject

Jerusalem syndrome: a delusive condition affecting some visitors to Jerusalem in which the sufferer identifies with a major figure from his or her religious background

Tuck: to push or fold into a small confined space or concealed place or between two surfaces: to tuck a letter into an envelope

Acetylene: a colorless flammable gas used in the manufacture of organic chemicals and in cutting and welding metals

Exasperate: 1) to cause great irritation or anger to; infuriate 2) to cause (an unpleasant feeling, condition, etc.) to worsen; aggravate

Run: to perform or accomplish by or as if by running: to run an errand

War of the Coprophages

Coprophagy: the eating of feces or dung

Fumigate: to treat (something contaminated or infected) with fumes or smoke

Fortuitous: happening by chance, especially by a lucky chance; unplanned; accidental

The boondocks: 1) wild, desolate, or uninhabitable country 2) a remote rural or provincial area

Anaphylaxis: an acute allergic reaction to an antigen (e.g. a bee sting) to which the body has become hypersensitive

Hoot: an amusing situation or person: your mum's a real hoot

Moult or **molt:** (of birds, mammals, reptiles, and arthropods) to shed (feathers, hair, skin, or cuticle)

Scarab: a large dung beetle of the eastern Mediterranean area, regarded as sacred in ancient Egypt

Epiphany: 1) the manifestation of a supernatural or divine reality 2) any moment of great or sudden revelation

Uber- or **über-:** indicating the highest, greatest, or most extreme example of something

Pang: a sudden strong feeling of emotional or physical pain

Ruminate: 1) think deeply about something: we sat ruminating on the nature of existence 2) (of a ruminant) chew the cud

Syzygy

Syzygy: either of the two positions (conjunction or opposition) of a celestial body when sun, earth, and the body lie in a straight line: *the moon is at syzygy when full*

Incredulity: the state of being unwilling or unable to believe something *he stared down the street in incredulity*

Bleachers: 1) (sometimes singular) a tier of seats in a sports stadium, etc., that are unroofed and inexpensive 2) the people occupying such seats

Angst: [mass noun] a feeling of deep anxiety or dread, typically an unfocused one about the human condition or the state of the world in general: angst-ridden sixth-formers • a feeling of persistent worry about something trivial: my hair causes me angst

Simpatico: (of a person) likeable and easy to get on with ■ having or characterized by shared attributes or interests; compatible: *a simpatico relationship*

Vortex: (pl. vortexes or vortices [-tisi:z]) a whirling mass of fluid or air, especially a whirlpool or whirlwind: we were caught in a vortex of water; a swirling vortex of emotions

Blow off: to reject or jilt (someone)

Grotesque

Gash: a long deep slash, cut, or wound: a bad gash in one leg became infected

Brindle: (especially of a domestic animal) brownish or tawny with streaks of other color: $a \ brindle \ pup$

Snap: if you snap your fingers, you make a sharp sound by moving your middle finger quickly across your thumb, for example in order to accompany music or to order someone to do something. She had millions of listeners snapping their fingers to her first single. He snapped his fingers, and Wilson produced a sheet of paper. She snapped her fingers at a passing waiter. Syn: **click**

Indulge: 1) [I, T] indulge (yourself) (in something) to allow yourself to have or do something for pleasure: I'm going to indulge myself and go shopping for some new clothes. • Maria never indulges in gossip. 2) [T] to give somebody/something what he/she/it wants or needs: You shouldn't indulge that child. It will make him very selfish. • At the weekends he indulges his passion for fishing.

Fair-haired: 1) having light-colored hair 2) (of a person) favorite; cherished: *the fair-haired boy of American advertising*

Strike out: to fail utterly

Piper Maru

Limp: (of a damaged ship, aircraft, or vehicle) proceed with difficulty: the badly damaged aircraft limped back to Sicily

Somatic: relating to the body, especially as distinct from the mind ■ relating to the soma (soma: the parts of an organism other than the reproductive cells ■ the body as distinct from the soul, mind, or psyche)

To pull a stunt or a **trick on someone:** to do something dramatic or silly in order to get their attention or trick them. *Everyone saw the stunt you pulled on me.*

Pore: be absorbed in reading or studying (something): *I spent hours poring over cookery books*.

Bilge: the flat bottom part of a ship or boat

Call in: to take (something) out of circulation, because it is defective or no longer useful

Apocrypha

Apocrypha: biblical or related writings not forming part of the accepted canon of Scripture ■ (apocrypha) writings or reports not considered genuine

Depth charge: an explosive charge designed to be dropped from a ship or aircraft and to explode under water at a preset depth, used for attacking submarines

Secretor: a person in whose saliva and other body fluids are found traces of the water-soluble A, B, or O agglutinogens that determine blood group

Keep one's head: remain calm

Mylar: a form of polyester resin used to make heat-resistant plastic films and sheets. It is made by copolymerizing ethylene glycol and terephthalic acid

Foo fighter: an unidentified flying object, originally one of a kind reported by US pilots during the Second World War, usually described as a bright light or ball of fire

Silo: an underground chamber in which a guided missile is kept ready for firing

Pusher

Cerulean: a) a deep blue color; azure b) (as adjective) a cerulean sea

Put a sock in it: be quiet!

Cold call: a call made by a salesman on a potential customer without making an appointment

Crank: a person with strange ideas or who behaves in a strange way

Ronin: (in feudal Japan) a wandering samurai who had no lord or master

Run by: If you run something by someone, you tell them about it or mention it, to see if they think it is a good idea, or can understand it. *I'm definitely interested, but I'll have to run it by Larry Estes. Run that by me again.*

Whammy: 1) something which has great, often negative, impact: *the double whammy of high interest rates and low wage increases* 2) an evil spell or curse: *she was convinced he had put the whammy on her*

Mundane: 1) everyday, ordinary, or banal 2) relating to the world or worldly matters

Hit the bricks: 1) to start walking; to go into the streets. I have a long way to go. I'd better hit the bricks. Go on! Hit the pavement! Get going! 2) to go out on strike. The workers hit the pavement on Friday and haven't been back on the job since. Agree to our demands, or we hit the bricks.

Lapel: the continuation of the turned or folded back collar on a suit coat, jacket, etc.

Fireplug: a hydrant for a fire hose

Pachyemia: thickening of the blood

Teso Dos Bichos

Squirrelly: an offensive term meaning very irrational or odd

Jejunum: the part of the small intestine between the duodenum and the ileum

Ileum: the part of the small intestine between the jejunum and the caecum

Chowder: a thick soup or stew containing clams or fish

Eviscerate: to remove the internal organs of; disembowel

Epithelium: an animal tissue consisting of one or more layers of closely packed cells covering the external and internal surfaces of the body. The cells vary in structure according to their function, which may be protective, secretory, or absorptive

Trip: to experience the effects of LSD or any other hallucinogenic drug

Hell Money

Tacky or **tackey:** I) slightly sticky or adhesive: *the varnish was still tacky* II) 1) shabby or shoddy 2) ostentatious and vulgar 3) (of a person) dowdy; seedy

Ginseng: 1) either of two araliaceous plants, Panax schinseng of China or P. quinquefolius of North America, whose forked aromatic roots are used medicinally 2) the root of either of these plants or a substance obtained from the roots, believed to possess stimulant, tonic, and energy-giving properties

Turmeric: 1) a tropical Asian zingiberaceous plant, Curcuma longa, having yellow flowers and an aromatic underground stem 2) the powdered stem of this plant, used as a condiment and as a yellow dye 3) any of several other plants with similar roots

Skullcap: any of various perennial plants of the genus Scutellaria, especially S. galericulata, that typically have helmet-shaped flowers

Buy off: to pay (a person or group) to drop a charge, end opposition, relinquish a claim, etc.

Lacquer: 1) a hard glossy coating made by dissolving cellulose derivatives or natural resins in a volatile solvent 2) a black resinous substance, obtained from certain trees, used to give a hard glossy finish to wooden furniture 3) lacquer tree 4) also called **hair lacquer:** a mixture of shellac and alcohol for spraying onto the hair to hold a style in place 5) decorative objects coated with such lacquer, often inlaid

Twiddle: turn back and forth

Tack: a short sharp-pointed nail, usually with a flat and comparatively large

Firetrap: a building that would burn easily or one without fire escapes

Jumpy: nervous

Drag one's heels: to act with deliberate slowness

Ruse: an action intended to mislead, deceive, or trick; stratagem

Hemo: relating to blood

Work-up: a complete diagnostic medical examination

Rubbing alcohol: a liquid usually consisting of 70 per cent denatured ethyl alcohol, used by external application as an antiseptic or rubefacient

Confabulation: the invention of circumstantial but fictitious detail about events supposed to have occurred in the past. Usually this is to disguise an inability to remember past events. It may be a symptom of any form of loss of memory, but typically occurs in Korsakoff's syndrome

Bleep: broadcasting to remove offensive material from a broadcast, and replace it with a short high-pitched electronic sound: They bleeped most of his comments

Blankety-blank: used in place of a word that is considered too rude to say or write

Tortuous: full of twists and turns: *the route is remote and tortuous* ■ excessively lengthy and complex: *a tortuous argument*

Brazen: 1) shameless and bold 2) made of or resembling brass 3) having a ringing metallic sound like that of a brass trumpet

Shudder: [I] to suddenly shake hard, especially because of an unpleasant feeling or thought: *Just to think about the accident makes me shudder.* • *The engine shuddered violently and then stopped.*

Flaunt: [T] to show something that you are proud of so that other people will admire it

Orgy: a wild gathering marked by promiscuous sexual activity, excessive drinking, etc.

Rigmarole or **rigamarole**: 1) any long complicated procedure 2) a set of incoherent or pointless statements; garbled nonsense

Nonplussed: 1) so surprised and confused that one is unsure how to react: *Henry looked completely nonplussed.* 2) not disconcerted; unperturbed

Avatar

Tonic water: a carbonated soft drink with a bitter flavour, used as a mixer with gin or other spirits (originally used as a stimulant of appetite and digestion)

Lime: a rounded citrus fruit similar to a lemon but greener, smaller, and with a distinctive acid flavor

Cervix: the neck

Indiscretion: If you talk about someone's indiscretion, you mean that they have done or said something that is risky, careless, or likely to upset people

Moonlight: have a second job in addition to one's regular employment: many instructors moonlight as professional consultants

Riffle: turn over something, especially the pages of a book, quickly and casually: *he riffled through the pages*

Succubus, -bi: 1) also called **succubae**: a female demon fabled to have sexual intercourse with sleeping men

Incubus: a demon believed in folklore to lie upon sleeping persons, especially to have sexual intercourse with sleeping women

Amylase: an enzyme, found chiefly in saliva and pancreatic fluid, that converts starch and glycogen into simple sugars

Trump up: to concoct or invent (a charge, accusation, etc.) so as to deceive or implicate someone

Do a number on: treat someone badly, typically by deceiving, humiliating, or criticizing them in a calculated way

Quagmire

Quagmire: 1) a soft marshy area of land that gives way when walked on 2) an awkward, complicated, or dangerous situation from which it is difficult to escape

Croak: a deep hoarse sound made by a frog or a crow ■ a sound resembling this, especially one made by a person: *Lorton tried to laugh* — *it came out as a croak*

Cove: small sheltered bay

Kennel: a small shelter for a dog

Defection: the desertion of one's country or cause in favour of an opposing one: *his defection from the Labour Party*

Sleight of hand: manual dexterity, typically in performing tricks: *a nifty bit of sleight of hand got the ashtray into the correct position* **\equiv** skillful deception: *this is financial sleight of hand of the worst sort*

Rambling: 1) (of writing or speech) lengthy and confused or inconsequential 2) (of a plant) putting out long shoots and growing over walls or other plants: *rambling roses* ■ (of a building or path) spreading or winding irregularly in various directions: *a big old rambling house*

Diatribe: a forceful and bitter verbal attack against someone or something: a diatribe against the Roman Catholic Church

Carapace: the hard upper shell of a tortoise, crustacean, or arachnid

Trout: any of various game fishes, especially Salmo trutta and related species, mostly of fresh water in northern regions: family Salmonidae (salmon). They resemble salmon but are smaller and spotted

Spool: a cylindrical device on which film, magnetic tape, thread, or other flexible materials can be wound; a reel: *spools of electrical cable*

Megalomaniac: a person who has an obsessive desire for power ■ a person who suffers delusions of their own power or importance

Come on to: make sexual advances toward

 $\mathbf{Peg}\ \mathbf{leg}$: an artificial leg, especially a wooden one \blacksquare a person with such an artificial leg

Flippant: not taking somebody seriously enough

Send on: send forward

Nick: a small cut or notch

Wetwired

Blind date: 1) a social meeting between two people who have not met before 2) either of the persons involved

Thorazine: chlorpromazine, a synthetic drug used as a tranquillizer, sedative, and anti-emetic

Methamphetamine: a synthetic drug with more rapid and lasting effects than amphetamine, used illegally as a stimulant and as a prescription drug to treat narcolepsy and maintain blood pressure.

 ${f Cut:}$ to absent oneself from (an activity, location, etc.), especially without permission or in haste: to~cut~class

Wiggy: emotionally uncontrolled or weird

Berserk: frenziedly violent or destructive (especially in the phrase go berserk)

Attenuate: make or become weaker

Touchdown: a six-point score made by carrying or passing the ball into the end zone of the opposing side

Bring something home to someone: make someone realize the full significance of something: *her first-hand account brought home to me the pain of the experience*

Tachistoscope: an instrument used for exposing objects to the eye for a very brief measured period of time

In on: acquainted with or sharing in: I was in on all his plans

Stick up for: support or defend (a person or cause)

Repress: subdue (someone or something) by force: *the uprisings were repressed* ■ restrain, prevent, or inhibit (the expression or development of something) *Isabel couldn't repress a sharp cry of fear.* ■ suppress (a thought or desire) so that it becomes or remains unconscious: *the thought that he had killed his brother was so terrible that he repressed it*

Subarachnoid: denoting or occurring in the fluid-filled space around the brain between the arachnoid membrane and the pia mater, through which major blood vessels pass

Up to speed: operating at full speed ■ (of a person or company) performing at an anticipated rate or level ■ (of a person) fully informed or up to date: that reminds me to bring you up to speed on the soap opera

Mete out: to mete out a punishment means to order that someone should be punished in a certain way

Cataloguer=cataloger: a librarian who classifies publication according to a categorial system

Chattel: movable property

Herrenvolk

Master race: a race, nation, or group, such as the Germans or Nazis as viewed by Hitler, believed to be superior to other races. German name: **Herrenvolk**

Take the cake: to surpass all others, especially in stupidity, folly, etc.

Hegemony: ascendancy or domination of one power or state within a league, confederation, etc., or of one social class over others

Cryptogram: a text written in code

Epithet: an adjective or phrase expressing a quality or attribute regarded as characteristic of the person or thing mentioned: *old men are often unfairly awarded the epithet 'dirty'* ■ an epithet used as a term of abuse: *the woman begins to hurl racial epithets at them*

Apiary: a bee-garden

Confocal: having a common focus or foci: *confocal ellipses* ■ denoting or using a microscope whose imaging system only collects light from a small spot on the specimen, giving greater resolution

Reductive: 1) tending to present a subject or problem in a simplified form, especially one viewed as crude: *such a conclusion by itself would be reductive* (with reference to art) minimal: *he combines his reductive abstract shapes with a rippled surface* 2) relating to chemical reduction

Rustle: 1) [no obj.] make a soft, muffled crackling sound like that caused by the movement of dry leaves or paper: *she came closer, her skirt swaying and rustling* ■ [with adverbial of direction] move with a rustling sound: *a nurse rustled in* ■ [with obj.] cause (something) to make a rustling sound: *Dolly rustled the paper irritably*. 2) [with obj.] round up and steal (cattle, horses, or sheep) 3) [no obj.] move or act quickly or energetically; hustle: *rustle around the kitchen, see what there is*

Sandlot: a piece of unoccupied land used by children for games ■ [as modifier] denoting or relating to sport played by amateurs: sandlot baseball

Bologna: a large smoked sausage made of bacon, veal, pork suet, and other meats

Catatonic: If you describe someone as being in a catatonic state, you mean that they are not moving or responding at all, usually as a result of illness, shock, or drugs: *and the traumatised heroine sinks into a catatonic trance*

Iffy: full of uncertainty; doubtful: the prospect for classes resuming next Wednesday seems iffy

Atrophy: to weaken or waste away through disuse or the effects of disease

Cloaca: a common cavity at the end of the digestive tract for the release of both excretory and genital products in vertebrates (except most mammals) and certain invertebrates. Specifically, the cloaca is present in birds, reptiles, amphibians, most fish, and monotremes

Occlusion: the blockage or closing of a blood vessel or hollow organ

Second-guess: 1) to criticize or evaluate with hindsight 2) to attempt to anticipate or predict (a person or thing)

Pass muster: to be acceptable

Polygene: a gene whose individual effect on a phenotype is too small to be observed, but which can act together with others to produce observable variation

Autosome: any chromosome that is not a sex chromosome

Bolt: rush away

Raspy: If someone has a raspy voice, they make rough sounds as if they have a sore throat or have difficulty in breathing

Shaving: 1) a thin strip cut off a surface: *she brushed wood shavings from her* knees 2) the action of shaving

Cranium: the skull, especially the part enclosing the brain

Centromere: the point on a chromosome by which it is attached to a spindle fiber during cell division

Slice and dice: divide a quantity of information up into smaller parts, especially in order to analyze it more closely or in different ways: each network has analysis teams that slice and dice the exit poll information to find a conclusion

Stiff: corpse

Melanocyte: a mature melanin-forming cell, especially in the skin

Inveigle: (often followed by *into* or an infinitive) to lead (someone into a situation) or persuade (to do something) by cleverness or trickery; cajole: *to inveigle customers into spending more*

Obfuscate: 1) to obscure or darken 2) to perplex or bewilder

Passionflower: an evergreen climbing plant of warm regions that bears distinctive flowers with parts that supposedly resemble instruments of the Crucifixion

Glycoside: a compound formed from a simple sugar and another compound by replacement of a hydroxyl group in the sugar molecule. Many drugs and poisons derived from plants are glycosides

Pituitary gland=the pituitary: a gland that is attached to the base of the brain. It produces hormones which affect growth, sexual development, and other functions of the body.

Out of it: 1) not included; rejected: I hate feeling out of it. 2) unaware of what is happening as a result of being uninformed unable to think or react properly, especially as a result of taking drugs or drinking too much alcohol

Knapsack: rucksack

Hypothalamus: a region of the forebrain below the thalamus which coordinates both the autonomic nervous system and the activity of the pituitary, controlling body temperature, thirst, hunger, and other homeostatic systems, and involved in sleep and emotional activity

Ineffable: 1) too great or intense to be expressed in words; unutterable 2) too sacred to be uttered 3) indescribable; indefinable

Unruhe

Awl: a pointed hand tool with a fluted blade used for piercing wood, leather,

Privy: (postpositive; followed by *to*) participating in the knowledge of something secret

Stun gun: a device designed to immobilize an animal or person temporarily without inflicting serious injury

Emulsion: 1) a fine dispersion of minute droplets of one liquid in another in which it is not soluble or miscible a fine dispersion of one liquid or puréed food substance in another: ravioli with pea and ginger emulsion 2) (also emulsion paint) [mass noun] a type of paint used for walls, consisting of pigment bound in a synthetic resin which forms an emulsion with water a light-sensitive coating for photographic films and plates, containing crystals of a silver compound dispersed in a medium such as gelatin

Scotograph: 1) (obsolete, rare) An instrument for writing in the dark, or by the blind 2) (photography, obsolete, rare) An impression made on a

photographic plate by a radioactive substance without the intervention of any opaque object other than the screen of the plate 3) (occultism) An image of a ghost or other apparition appearing on unexposed film

Morphine: an analgesic and narcotic drug obtained from opium and used medicinally to relieve pain

Scopolamine: a poisonous plant alkaloid used as an antiemetic in motion sickness, as a preoperative medication for examination of the eye, and formerly as a sedative and hypnotic

Twilight sleep: a state of partial narcosis or stupor without total loss of consciousness, in particular a state induced by an injection of morphine and scopolamine, formerly popular for use during childbirth

Leukotomy: the surgical cutting of white nerve fibers within the brain, especially prefrontal lobotomy, formerly used to treat mental illness

Tape off: cordon (off), seal (off), close (off), shut (off), mark (off), fence (off); isolate, segregate

Foreman: a person, often experienced, who supervises other workmen. Gender-neutral form: **supervisor**

Hydrobrimode: a salt resulting, or regarded as resulting, from the reaction of hydrobromic acid with an organic base (e.g. an amine).

Goon: 1) a silly, foolish, or eccentric person 2) a bully or thug, especially a member of an armed or security force

In passing: by the way; incidentally: he mentioned your visit in passing

Monger: 1) (in combination except in archaic use) a trader or dealer: *ironmonger* 2) (in combination) a promoter of something unpleasant: *warmonger*

Sanguinarium

Blepharoplasty: surgical repair or reconstruction of an eyelid

Antacid: 1) (chiefly of a medicine) preventing or correcting acidity, especially in the stomach 2) an antacid medicine

Veritable: absolute: used to emphasize a figurative concept: *The business is a veritable gold mine.*

Pentagram: a five-pointed star that is formed by drawing a continuous line in five straight segments, often used as a mystic and magical symbol

Rhinoplasty: plastic surgery performed on the nose

Collagen: the main structural protein found in animal connective tissue, yielding gelatin when boiled

Impropriety: failure to observe standards of honesty or modesty; improper behaviour or character

Vainglorious: boastful or vain; ostentatious

Belladonna: deadly nightshade ■ a drug prepared from the leaves and root of this, containing atropine

Hex: curse

Jest: speak in a joking way: you jest, surely?

Barge in: if you barge in or barge in on someone, you rudely interrupt what they are doing or saying: I'm sorry to barge in like this, but I have a problem I hope you can solve.

Pica: an abnormal craving to ingest substances such as clay, dirt, or hair, sometimes occurring during pregnancy, in persons with chlorosis, etc.

Osteoplasty: the branch of surgery concerned with bone repair or bone grafting

Magnanimous: generous and noble

Laparotomy: a surgical incision into the abdominal cavity, for diagnosis or in preparation for major surgery

Fortean: relating to or denoting paranormal phenomena

Transient: 1) a person who is staying or working in a place for a short time only 2) a momentary variation in current, voltage, or frequency

Aspergillus: a genus of fungi, including many common moulds, some of which cause infections of the respiratory system in humans. The species A. fumigatus causes aspergillosis. A. niger is commonly found in the external ear and can become pathogenic.

Compost: decayed organic material used as a fertilizer for growing plants ■ a mixture of compost or similar material with loam soil used as a growing medium

Methyl bromide: a colourless poisonous gas or volatile liquid with an odour resembling that of chloroform, used as a solvent, and extinguishant. Formula: CH3Br

Mycology: the scientific study of fungi

Dermatophytosis: a fungal infection of the skin, especially the feet

Athlete's foot: a fungal infection affecting mainly the skin between the toes. It is a form of ringworm

Blight: a plant disease, especially one caused by fungi such as mildews, rusts, and smuts: the vines suffered blight and disease; potato blight ■ [in] a thing that spoils or damages something: her remorse could be a blight on that happiness ■ an ugly, neglected, or rundown condition of an urban area: the depressing urban blight that lies to the south of the city

A run for (one's) money: a) a strong challenge or close competition b) pleasure derived from an activity

Conidium: a spore produced asexually by various fungi at the tip of a specialized hypha

Bolide: a large meteor which explodes in the atmosphere

Aspirate: 1) a) to articulate (a stop) with some force, so that breath escapes with audible friction as the stop is released b) to pronounce (a word or syllable) with an initial h 2) to draw in or remove by inhalation or suction, especially to suck (air or fluid) from a body cavity or to inhale (fluid) into the lungs after vomiting 3) to supply air to (an internal-combustion engine)

Pneumothorax: the presence of air or gas in the cavity between the lungs and the chest wall, causing collapse of the lung

Sans: without, minus

Slew: a great number or amount; a lot

Commendation: 1) the act or an instance of commending; praise 2) an

Coldcock: knock somebody out

Excise: cut out surgically: the precision with which surgeons can excise brain tumours

Mastoid: 1) shaped like a nipple or breast 2) designating or relating to a nipple-like process of the temporal bone behind the ear

Craniotomy: surgical removal of a portion of the skull ■ surgical perforation of the skull of a dead fetus to ease delivery

Galvanic: 1) relating to or involving electric currents produced by chemical action 2) sudden and dramatic: *a searing, galvanic experience*

Epoxy: an adhesive, plastic, or other material made from a class of synthetic thermosetting polymers containing epoxide groups

Paperweight: a small heavy object placed on loose papers to prevent them from scattering

Glioma: a malignant tumour of the glial tissue of the nervous system

Alter ego: 1) a second self 2) a very close and intimate friend

Myeloid: 1) relating to bone marrow ■ (of leukaemia) characterized by the proliferation of cells originating in the bone marrow 2) relating to the spinal cord

Sarcoma: a malignant tumour of connective or other non-epithelial tissue

Dress: treat or prepare (something) in a certain way, in particular: ■ clean, treat, or apply a dressing to (a wound) ■ clean and prepare (food, especially poultry or shellfish) for cooking or eating

Never Again

Cryogenics: the branch of physics dealing with the production and effects of very low temperatures ■ another term for cryonics

Gal: a girl or woman

Impulsive: characterized by actions based on sudden desires, whims, or inclinations rather than careful thought: *an impulsive man*

Crummy: 1) of little value; inferior; contemptible 2) unwell or depressed

Hammered: very drunk

Petty: 1) small and unimportant: *He didn't want to get involved with the petty details; petty crime/theft (= that is not very serious)* 2) unkind or unpleasant to other people (for a reason that does not seem very important): *petty jealousy/revenge*

Scab: the dried crusty surface of a healing skin wound or sore

Ergot: 1) [mass noun] a fungal disease of rye and other cereals in which black elongated fruiting bodies grow in the ears of the cereal. Eating contaminated food can result in ergotism ● The fungus is Claviceps purpurea, subdivision Ascomycotina ■ the fruiting bodies of the ergot fungus, used as a source of certain medicinal alkaloids, especially for inducing uterine contractions or controlling post-partum bleeding 2) a small horny protuberance on the back of each of a horse's fetlocks

Memento Mori

Memento mori: an object, such as a skull, intended to remind people of the inevitability of death

Numinous: mysterious or awe-inspiring

Pharynx: the membrane-lined cavity behind the nose and mouth, connecting them to the oesophagus. Ajdective: Pharyngeal

Concha: a part resembling a spiral shell, in particular: ■ the depression in the external ear leading to its central opening ■ (also nasal concha) any of several thin, scroll-like (turbinate) bones in the sides of the nasal cavity

Sphenoid: a compound bone which forms the base of the cranium, behind the eye and below the front part of the brain. It has two pairs of broad lateral 'wings' and a number of other projections, and contains two air-filled sinuses

Overnight: for use overnight: an overnight bag

Aegis: the protection, backing, or support of a particular person or organization: *negotiations were conducted under the aegis of the UN*

Barren: archaic (of a woman) unable to have children ■ (of a female animal) not pregnant or unable to become so

Kaddish

Callow: immature

Vigilante: 1) one of an organized group of citizens who take upon themselves the protection of their district, properties, etc. 2) also called **vigilance man:** a member of a vigilance committee

Shroud: a garment or piece of cloth used to wrap a dead body

Golem: (in Jewish legend) a clay figure brought to life by magic ■ an automaton or robot

Amok: (in phrase **run amok**) behave uncontrollably and disruptively: *stone-throwing anarchists were running amok*

Incantation: 1) ritual recitation of magic words or sounds 2) the formulaic words or sounds used; a magic spell

Abomination: 1) a person or thing that is disgusting 2) an action that is vicious, vile, etc. 3) intense loathing

Unrequited

Unrequited: (of love, affection, etc.) not reciprocated or returned

Cut someone off: interrupt someone while they are speaking ■ interrupt someone during a telephone call by breaking the connection: I listened to prerecorded messages for twenty-three minutes before being cut off. ■ prevent someone from receiving or being provided with something, especially power or water: consumers cut off for nonpayment ■ reject someone as one's heir; disinherit someone: Gabrielle's family cut her off without a penny ■ prevent someone from having access to somewhere or someone; isolate someone from something they previously had connections with: we were cut off from reality ■ informal (of a driver) overtake someone and pull in too closely in front of them

Shakedown: 1) organization or group: the shakedown of the Bank of England in the fall of 1992 ■ a thorough search of a person or place: harassment and shakedowns by persons in police uniforms ■ a swindle; a piece of extortion: he wants to eliminate bribery, shakedowns, and bidrigging in New York City's construction industry ■ a test of a new product or model, especially a vehicle or ship: the high-orbit shakedown of the lunar module had its merits; [as modifier] the software is expected to enter its final shakedown phase by the middle of September 2) a makeshift bed

Proffer: hold out or put forward (something) to someone for acceptance: *she proffered a glass of wine; he proffered his resignation*

Conjunctiva: the mucous membrane that covers the front of the eye and lines the inside of the eyelid

Scotoma: a partial loss of vision or blind spot in an otherwise normal visual field

Macula: an oval yellowish area surrounding the fovea near the centre of the retina in the eye, which is the region of keenest vision

Disavow: to deny knowledge of, connection with, or responsibility for

Gallantry: 1) courageous behaviour, especially in battle: *a medal awarded for outstanding gallantry during the raid* 2) polite attention or respect given by men to women ■ [count noun] (gallantries) gallant actions or words

Subpoena: [C] (law) a written order to attend a court of law to give evidence:

She is appearing today under subpoena (= she has been given a subpoena to appear in court). Subpoena [T]: The court subpoenaed her to appear as a witness.

Tempus Fugit

Tempus fugit: [Latin] time flies

Goo: 1) a sticky or slimy substance 2) excessive sentimentality

Fissile: 1) (of an atom or element) able to undergo nuclear fission: *a fissile isotope* 2) (chiefly of rock) easily split

Jamb: a side post or surface of a doorway, window, or fireplace

Max

Intubate: insert a tube into (a person or a body part, especially the trachea for ventilation)

Tractor beam: (in science fiction) a hypothetical beam of energy that can be used to move objects such as space ships or hold them stationary

Whopper: a thing that is extremely or unusually large: *the novel is a 1,079 page whopper* ■ a gross or blatant lie: *he's telling whoppers*

Rummage: search unsystematically and untidily through something

Rummage sale: is a sale of cheap used goods that is usually held to raise money for charity.

Synchrony

Betwixt: between

Betwixt and between: in an intermediate, indecisive, or middle position

Cryobiology: the branch of biology which deals with the properties of organisms and tissues at low temperatures

Vitrify: convert (something) into glass or a glasslike substance, typically by exposure to heat

Trehalose: a sugar of the disaccharide class produced by some fungi, yeasts, and similar organisms

Febrile: 1) having or showing the symptoms of a fever: *a febrile illness* 2) characterized by a great deal of nervous excitement or energy: *the febrile atmosphere of the city*

Small Potatoes

Small potatoes: (functioning as singular or plural) someone or something of little significance or value, especially a small amount of money

Coccyx: a small triangular bone at the base of the spinal column in humans and some apes, formed of fused vestigial vertebrae

The birds and the bees: basic facts about sex and reproduction, as told to a child

Motile: 1) (of cells, gametes, and single-celled organisms) capable of motion 2) relating to or characterized by responses that involve muscular rather than audiovisual sensations

Eyeball: look or stare at closely: we eyeballed one another

Pellagra: a deficiency disease caused by a lack of nicotinic acid or its precursor tryptophan in the diet. It is characterized by dermatitis, diarrhoea, and mental disturbance, and is often linked to over-dependence on maize as a staple food

Spry: active and brisk; nimble

Quicklime=calcium oxide: a white crystalline base used in the production of calcium hydroxide and bleaching powder and in the manufacture of glass, paper, and steel. Formula: CaO

Striated: marked with parallel grooves, ridges, stripes, or narrow bands

Get in on: become involved in (a profitable or exciting activity)

Penology: the study of the punishment of crime and of prison management

Taffeta: a fine lustrous silk or similar synthetic fabric with a crisp texture

Cummerbund: a sash worn around the waist, especially as part of a man's formal evening suit

Zero Sum

Dork: 1) a stupid or incompetent person 2) a penis

Folic acid: a vitamin of the B complex found especially in leafy green vegetables, liver, and kidney

Pock=pockmark: small scar left by skin disease

Entomology: the branch of zoology concerned with the study of insects

Off-hand: 1) If you say that someone is being off-hand, you are critical of them for being unfriendly or impolite, and not showing any interest in what other people are doing or saying. Consumers found the attitude of its staff off-hand and generally offensive to the paying customer. 2) If you say something off-hand, you say it without checking the details or facts of it. Were they at home or away, do you know off hand?

Duplicity: deception; double-dealing

Elegy

Elegy: 1) a mournful or plaintive poem or song, especially a lament for the dead 2) poetry or a poem written in elegiac couplets or stanzas

Harbinger: 1) a person or thing that announces or indicates the approach of something; forerunner 2) *obsolete* a person sent in advance of a royal party or army to obtain lodgings for them

Wraith: 1) the apparition of a person living or thought to be alive, supposed to appear around the time of his death 2) a ghost or any apparition 3) an insubstantial copy of something 4) something pale, thin, and lacking in substance, such as a column of smoke

Dystonia: a neurological disorder, caused by disease of the basal ganglia, in which the muscles of the trunk, shoulders, and neck go into spasm, so that the head and limbs are held in unnatural positions

Cop to: accept or admit to: there are a lot of people who don't cop to their past

Draw on: 1) to use or exploit (a source, fund, etc.): to draw on one's experience 2) to come near: the time for his interview drew on 3) to withdraw (money) from (an account) 4) to put on (clothes) 5) to lead further; entice or encourage: the prospect of nearing his goal drew him on

Keel over: (of a boat or ship) turn over on its side; capsize ■ (of a person or thing) fall over; collapse

Emphysema: a serious medical condition that occurs when the lungs become larger and do not work properly, causing difficulty in breathing

Demons

Dry off: If something dries off or if you dry it off, the moisture on its surface disappears or is removed. They are then scrubbed with clean water and left to dry off for an hour or two in a warm room. When the bath water started to cool I got out, dried myself off, and dressed.

Encephalitis: inflammation of the brain, caused by infection or an allergic reaction

Histology: the study of the microscopic structure of tissues

Jog: to remind; stimulate: please jog my memory

Ketamine: a synthetic compound used as an anesthetic and analgesic drug and also (illicitly) as a hallucinogen

Dura mater: the outermost and toughest of the three membranes covering the brain and spinal cord

Lay claim to something: to say that you have a right to something, or take what you think you have a right to

Gethsemane

Hard science: a) one of the natural or physical sciences, such as physics, chemistry, biology, geology, or astronomy b) (as modifier) *a hard-science lecture*

Predation: a relationship between two species of animal in a community, in which one (the predator) hunts, kills, and eats the other (the prey)

Moraine: a mass of rocks and sediment carried down and deposited by a glacier, typically as ridges at its edges or extremity

Geodesy: the branch of mathematics dealing with the shape and area of the earth or large portions of it

Circumspect: wary and unwilling to take risks: *the officials were very circumspect in their statements*

Assiduous: (formal) working very hard and taking great care that everything is done as well as it can be

Short of: except: nothing short of a miracle can save him now

Deliquesce: (of organic matter) become liquid, typically during decomposition

Chromatography: the technique of separating and analyzing the components of a mixture of liquids or gases by selective adsorption in, for example, a column of powder (column chromatography) or on a strip of paper (paper chromatography)

Unbridled: uncontrolled; unconstrained: a moment of unbridled ambition; unbridled lust

Adept: person who is skilled or proficient at something: *he is an adept at imitation*

Agitprop: political (originally communist) propaganda, especially in art or literature

Redux

Redux: brought back, especially in being restored to former importance or prominence

Folly: an act that is not sensible and may have a bad result: *It would be folly to ignore their warnings*.

Paleoclimatology: the study of prehistoric climates on a global or regional scale from evidence preserved in glacial deposits, sedimentary structures, and fossils

Square off: to assume a posture of offence or defence, as in boxing

Chimeric: describes an organism that is composed of genetically different tissues, either naturally or as a result of a laboratory procedure

Morula: a solid ball of cells resulting from division of a fertilized ovum, and from which a blastula is formed

Blastula: an animal embryo at the early stage of development when it is a hollow ball of cells

Gastrula: an embryo at the stage following the blastula, when it is a hollow cup-shaped structure having three layers of cells

Befall: (especially of something bad) happen to (someone)

Redux II

Mole: someone within an organization who anonymously betrays confidential information

Cytolysis: the dissolution or disruption of cells, especially by an external agent

Minister: (often followed by to) to attend to the needs (of); take care (of)

Bench warrant: a warrant issued by a judge or court directing that an offender be apprehended

Unusual Suspects

Jimmy: a short crowbar used by a burglar to force open a window or door

Narc: a narcotics agent

Jabber: talk rapidly and excitedly but with little sense

Squiggle: 1) a wavy or curly line or movement 2) an illegible handwritten word or words

Ergotamine: a compound present in some kinds of ergot. An alkaloid, it causes constriction of blood vessels and is used in the treatment of migraine

Histamine: a compound which is released by cells in response to injury and in allergic and inflammatory reactions, causing contraction of smooth muscle and dilation of capillaries

Aerosolize: convert into a fine spray or colloidal suspension in air: the drug is being tested in an aerosolized form

Detour

Unstick: to free or loosen (something stuck)

Consort: habitually associate with (someone), typically with the disapproval of others: *you chose to consort with the enemy*

Cull: reduce the population of (a wild animal) by selective slaughter: *he sees culling deer as a necessity*

Put someone on: deceive or hoax someone

Holler: give a loud shout or cry

Clip: a metal holder containing cartridges for an automatic firearm

Bustline: the measurement round a woman's body at the bust: *these figure-enhancing bras will immediately increase your bustline*

Carry a tune: to be able to sing in tune

The Post-Modern Prometheus

Groggy: 1) dazed or staggering, as from exhaustion, blows, or drunkenness 2) faint or weak

Conk out: 1) (of machines, cars, etc.) to fail suddenly 2) to tire suddenly or collapse, as from exhaustion

Ligation: the surgical procedure of tying a ligature tightly around a blood vessel or other duct or tube in the body

Range: a large stove with burners and one or more ovens, usually heated by solid fuel

Tumbler: a drinking glass with straight sides and no handle or stem

Coaster: a small tray or mat placed under a bottle or glass to protect the table underneath

Pigsty: a pen or enclosure for a pig or pigs ■ a very dirty or untidy house or room

Humor: to attempt to gratify; indulge

Hunchback: a back deformed by a sharp forward angle, forming a hump, typically caused by collapse of a vertebra ■ a person with a hunchback

Homeotic: describes mutation in which one part or organ is transformed into another part associated with a different segment of the organism

Morphogenesis: 1) the origin and development of morphological characteristics 2) the formation of landforms or other structures

Drosophila: a small fruit fly, used extensively in genetic research because of its large chromosomes, numerous varieties, and rapid rate of reproduction

Mewl: cry feebly or querulously; whimper: *dozens of mewling babies* ■ (of a cat or bird) mew: *the mewling cry of a hawk*

Hick: a person who lives in the country, regarded as being unintelligent or parochial

Fritter: a piece of fruit, vegetable, or meat that is coated in batter and deepfried

Grits: a dish of coarsely ground maize kernels boiled with water or milk

Flapjack: 1) a sweet dense cake made from oats, golden syrup, and melted butter, served in rectangles 2) a pancake

Poach: cook (an egg), without its shell, in or over boiling water

Phantasm: an illusion, apparition, or ghost: the cart seemed to glide like a terrible phantasm

Prefigure: be an early indication or version of (something): the Hussite movement prefigured the Reformation

Fiend: 1) a very cruel person 2) a person who is very interested in one particular thing: *a health fiend*

Christmas Carol

Cantaloupe: a round melon with a netted, often ridged rind and aromatic orange flesh

Uncanny: 1) characterized by apparently supernatural wonder, horror, etc. 2) beyond what is normal or expected: *an uncanny accuracy*

Tidbit: 1) a small but very nice piece of food 2) an interesting piece of information

Hemolytic: relating to or involving the rupture or destruction of red blood cells: *hemolytic anemia*

Emily

At sea: a) on the ocean b) in a state of confusion

Necrotizing: causing or undergoing the death of cells: necrotizing bacteria

Kitsunegari

Stab: attempt, try; go, shot, crack, bash

Ideogram or **ideograph:** 1) a sign or symbol, used in such writing systems as those of China or Japan, that directly represents a concept, idea, or thing rather than a word or set of words for it 2) any graphic sign or symbol, such as %, @, &, etc.

On the nose: a) (in horse-race betting) to win only: I bet twenty pounds on the nose on that horse b) precisely; exactly c) bad or bad-smelling

Brush: a brief encounter with someone or something unpleasant or notable: a brush with death; my first brush with fame

Flighty: fickle and irresponsible: her mother was a flighty Southern belle

Schizogony

Schizogony: asexual reproduction in protozoans that is characterized by multiple fission

Mud pie: mud made into a pie shape by a child

To come to a head: reach a crisis: the violence came to a head with the deaths of six youths

Stern: strict

Have it coming: be due for retribution on account of something bad that one has done: *his uppity sister-in-law had it coming to her*

Tee off (on): to make somebody angry or annoyed

Stand up to: a) to confront or resist courageously b) to withstand or endure (wear, criticism, etc.)

Tuck away: 1) to eat (a large amount of food) 2) to store, especially in a place difficult to find

Put on airs: assume a haughty manner, pretend to be better than one is: *I'm sick of Claire and the way she puts on airs*.

Affect: pretend to have or feel (something): as usual I affected a supreme unconcern

Mullion: a vertical bar between the panes of glass in a window

Scrawny: 1) very thin and bony; scraggy 2) meager or stunted: *scrawny vegetation*

Put down roots: (of a plant) begin to draw nourishment from the soil through its roots ■ (of a person) begin to have a settled life in a particular place

Chinga

Divination: the practice of seeking knowledge of the future or the unknown by supernatural means

Wicca: the religious cult of modern witchcraft, especially an initiatory tradition founded in England in the mid 20th century

Familiar: 1) a demon supposedly attending and obeying a witch, often said to assume the form of an animal 2) (in the Roman Catholic Church) a person rendering certain services in a pope's or bishop's household 3) a close friend or associate

Bloodstone: a green gemstone that is spotted or streaked with red, consisting of a variety of chalcedony

Carry on with: be engaged in a love affair, typically one of which the speaker disapproves: she was carrying on with young Adam

Tantrum: a childish fit of rage; outburst of bad temper

Shoestring: 1) another word for **shoelace** 2) a) a very small or petty amount of money (especially in the phrase **on a shoestring**) b) (as modifier) a *shoestring budget*

Be waiting in the wings: to be ready to be used or employed instead of someone or something else. In the theatre, the wings are the sides of the stage which cannot be seen by the people watching the play, where actors wait until it is their turn to walk on to the stage.

Whelp: a puppy ■ a cub ■ a boy or young man (often as a disparaging form of address)

Chorea: a neurological disorder characterized by jerky involuntary movements affecting especially the shoulders, hips, and face

Brat: a child, especially one who is ill-mannered or unruly. Used contemptuously or playfully

Davy Jones: 1) also called **Davy Jones's locker:** the ocean's bottom, especially when regarded as the grave of those lost or buried at sea 2) the spirit or devil of the sea

Head shop: a store that sells drug-related paraphernalia

Kill Switch

One-off: occurring once

Alphanumeric or **alphanumerical:** using both letters and numbers: *an alphanumeric code*

Ooze: slow flowing or leaking

Wean: accustom (an infant or other young mammal) to food other than its mother's milk ■ (often wean someone off) accustom (someone) to managing without something which they have become dependent on: the doctor tried to wean her off the sleeping pills ■ (be weaned on) be strongly influenced by (something), especially from an early age: I was weaned on a regular diet of Hollywood fantasy.

Gnarly: 1) gnarled 2) difficult, dangerous, or challenging: *she battled through the gnarly first sequence* ■ unpleasant; unattractive: *train stations can be pretty gnarly places*

Overkill: 1) the capability to deploy more weapons, especially nuclear weapons, than is necessary to ensure military advantage 2) any capacity or treatment that is greater than that required or appropriate

Mingle: cause to mix together: the sound of voices mingled with a scraping of chairs; a smell which mingled disinfectant and soap ■ move among and engage with others at a social function: a chance to mingle with celebs

Palimony: compensation made by one member of an unmarried couple to the other after separation

Bad Blood

Bad blood: a feeling of intense hatred or hostility; enmity

Exuberant: enthusiastic

Rustic: 1) of, characteristic of, or living in the country; rural 2) having qualities ascribed to country life or people; simple; unsophisticated: *rustic pleasures* 3) crude, awkward, or uncouth 4) made of untrimmed branches: *a rustic seat* 5) denoting or characteristic of a style of furniture popular in England in the 18th and 19th centuries, in which the legs and feet of chairs, tables, etc., were made to resemble roots, trunks, and branches of trees 6) (of masonry) having a rusticated finish

Locus: 1) (in many legal phrases) a place or area, especially the place where something occurred 2) a set of points whose location satisfies or is determined by one or more specified conditions: *the locus of points*

equidistant from a given point is a circle 3) the position of a particular gene on a chromosome

Incisor: a chisel-edged tooth at the front of the mouth. In man there are four in each jaw

Chloral hydrate: a colorless crystalline soluble solid produced by the reaction of chloral with water and used as a sedative and hypnotic; 2,2,2-trichloro-1,1-ethanediol. Formula: CCl3CH(OH)2

Slip a mickey: A term used to refer to put a sleeping pill in one's beverage

Clearing: an area with few or no trees or shrubs in wooded or overgrown land

Mortician=undertaker: a person whose profession is the preparation of the dead for burial or cremation and the management of funerals; funeral director

Bucktooth: a projecting upper front tooth

Overbite: an extension of the upper front teeth over the lower front teeth when the mouth is closed

Quandary: a situation or circumstance that presents problems difficult to solve; predicament; dilemma

Manducate: to eat or chew

Millet: a cereal grass, Setaria italica, cultivated for grain and animal fodder

Bird dog: to control closely with unceasing vigilance

Dale: an open valley, usually in an area of low hills

Gnaw: 1) to bite (at) or chew (upon) constantly so as to wear away little by little 2) to form by gnawing: *to gnaw a hole* 3) to cause erosion of (something) 4) to cause constant distress or anxiety (to)

Pull up stakes: to leave one's home or temporary resting place and move on

Patient X

Firmament: the expanse of the sky; heavens

Ontology: 1) the branch of metaphysics that deals with the nature of being 2) the set of entities presupposed by a theory

Neurosis: a relatively mild mental disorder, characterized by symptoms such as hysteria, anxiety, depression, or obsessive behaviour

Constipated: 1) suffering from constipation 2) subject to restriction or blockage in a flow of productive activity or creativity

Accost: to approach, stop, and speak to (a person), as to ask a question, accuse of a crime, solicit sexually, etc.

Tiptoe: 1) to walk with the heels off the ground and the weight supported by the ball of the foot and the toes 2) to walk silently or stealthily

The Red and the Black

Trump card: 1) in card games, a card from a suit declared to be higher in value than any other suit, or the suit itself 2) a highly valuable resource or advantage, especially one held in reserve for future use 3) an admirable or reliable person

Cogent: strongly and clearly expressed in a way that influences what people believe: a cogent argument/reason

Hypnagogic: of or relating to the state just before one is fully asleep

Gestalt: (sometimes not capital) a perceptual pattern or structure possessing qualities as a whole that cannot be described merely as a sum of its parts

Infantilize: 1) to make somebody infantile, or keep somebody in an infantile state 2) to treat somebody as or consider somebody to be infantile

Beg: to ask (someone) for (something or leave to do something) formally, humbly, or earnestly: *I beg forgiveness; I beg to differ*

Travelers

Mope: a gloomy person

Snuff: to put an end to somebody or something: *snuff out enthusiasm; made a diving catch that snuffed a sixth-inning rally*

Vermin: 1) small animals or insects that harm people, livestock, property, or crops and are difficult to control, e.g. rats, weasels, fleas, or cockroaches 2) an offensive term for a person or group considered to be extremely unpleasant or undesirable

Patriate: to bring under the authority of an autonomous country, for example as in the transfer of the Canadian constitution from UK to Canadian responsibility

Bigwig: an important person

Stink: a great deal of trouble (especially in the phrase to make, kick up or raise a stink)

Xeno-: indicating something strange, different, or foreign

Unwitting: 1) not knowing or conscious 2) not intentional; inadvertent

Stalking-horse: 1) a horse or an imitation one used by a hunter to hide behind while stalking his quarry 2) something serving as a means of concealing plans; pretext 3) a candidate put forward by one group to divide the opposition or mask the candidacy of another person for whom the stalking-horse would then withdraw

Throw in: to contribute or interpose (a remark, argument, etc.), especially in a discussion

Mind's Eve

Mind's eye: the visual memory or the imagination

(Bang) Dead to rights: in the act; (guilty) without question. We caught her dead to rights with the loot still on her. There he was, bang dead to rights with the smoking gun still in his hands.

Cabbie: a cab driver

Piss-poor: of a contemptibly low standard or quality; pathetic

Snake: a tool in the form of a long flexible wire for unblocking drains

Stash: to put or store (money, valuables, etc.) in a secret place, as for safekeeping

Colliculus: a small elevation, as on the surface of the optic lobe of the brain

Gun for: 1) to search for in order to reprimand, punish, or kill 2) to try earnestly for: *he was gunning for promotion*

Salivate: 1) to secrete saliva, especially an excessive amount 2) to cause (a laboratory animal, etc.) to produce saliva, as by the administration of mercury

Abet: to assist or encourage, especially in crime or wrongdoing

Keep tabs on: to keep a watchful eye on

Sacrament: 1) an outward sign combined with a prescribed form of words and regarded as conferring some specific grace upon those who receive it. The Protestant sacraments are baptism and the Lord's Supper. In the Roman Catholic and Eastern Churches they are baptism, penance, confirmation, the Eucharist, holy orders, matrimony, and the anointing of the sick (formerly extreme unction) 2) (often capital) the Eucharist 3) the consecrated elements of the Eucharist, especially the bread 4) something regarded as possessing a sacred or mysterious significance 5) a symbol; pledge

Open-and-shut: easily decided or solved; obvious: an open-and-shut case

Genuflect: 1) to act in a servile or deferential manner 2) to bend one or both knees as a sign of reverence, especially when passing before the Blessed Sacrament

Polydactyl: 1) (of man and other vertebrates) having more than the normal number of digits 2) a human or other vertebrate having more than the normal number of digits

Confer: to hold or take part in a conference or consult together

Mote: a tiny speck

Seraph: an angel of the highest rank of nine orders of angels in the traditional Christian hierarchy

 $\textbf{Figment:} \ a \ fantastic \ notion, \ invention, \ or \ fabrication: \ a \ figment \ of \ the \ imagination$

The Pine Bluff Variant

Bearer bond: a bond payable only to the party that presents it

Vector=carrier: an organism, especially an insect, that carries a disease-producing microorganism from one host to another, either within or on the surface of its body

Vie: (followed by *with* or *for*) to contend for superiority or victory (with) or strive in competition (for)

Ringing: expressed in a definite, unrestrained way

Front: an apparently respectable person, organization, or business acting as a cover for illegal or secret activities: *The grocery store was a front for drug deals.*

Deal in: to let somebody join in a card game or some other form of joint activity: *Deal me in.*

Usherette: a woman assistant in a cinema, theatre, etc., who shows people to their seats

Streptococcus: any Gram-positive spherical bacterium of the genus Streptococcus, typically occurring in chains and including many pathogenic species, such as S. pyogenes, which causes scarlet fever, sore throat, etc.: family Lactobacillaceae. Often shortened to: **strep**

Gimp: a physically disabled person, especially one who is lame

Come through: 1) (adverb) to emerge successfully 2) (preposition) to survive (an illness, setback, etc.)

Folie à Deux

Folie à deux: mental illness occurring simultaneously in two intimately related persons who share some of the elements of the illness, such as delusions

Siding: material attached to the outside of a building to make it weatherproof

Warren: 1) a series of interconnected underground tunnels in which rabbits live 2) a colony of rabbits 3) an overcrowded area or dwelling

Deacon: 1) (in the Roman Catholic and other episcopal churches) an ordained minister ranking immediately below a priest 2) (in Protestant churches) a lay official appointed or elected to assist the minister, especially in secular affairs 3) the president of an incorporated trade or body of craftsmen in a burgh

Agnosia: loss or diminution of the power to recognize familiar objects or people, usually as a result of brain damage

Stipple: 1) to draw, engrave, or paint using dots or flecks 2) to apply paint, powder, etc., to (something) with many light dabs 3) to give (wet paint, cement, etc.) a granular effect

Vouch: 1) (usually followed by *for*) to give personal assurance; guarantee: *I'll vouch for his safety* 2) to furnish supporting evidence (for) or function as proof (of)

The End

Catwalk: 1) a narrow ramp extending from the stage into the audience in a theatre, nightclub, etc., especially as used by models in a fashion show 2) a narrow pathway over the stage of a theatre, along a bridge, etc.

Solar plexus: the network of sympathetic nerves situated behind the stomach that supply the abdominal organs. Also called **coeliac plexus.**

Goof on: to tease or kid someone: *I don't believe you. I think you're just goofing on me.*

Posit: to assume or put forward as fact or the factual basis for an argument; postulate

Free-for-all: a disorganized brawl or argument, usually involving all those present

Snug: small but comfortable: a snug cottage

Clairvoyant: a person claiming to have the power to foretell future events

Cruller: a light sweet ring-shaped cake, fried in deep fat

Dorf: a stupid person; a weird person: You are a prize-winning dorf.

With an eye to: (preposition) a) regarding; with reference to: with an eye to one's own interests b) with the intention or purpose of: with an eye to reaching agreement

Parapsychology: the study of mental phenomena, such as telepathy, which are beyond the scope of normal physical explanation

Chickadee: any of various small North American songbirds of the genus Parus, such as P. atricapillus (black-capped chickadee), typically having grey-and-black plumage: family Paridae (titmice)

Legate: 1) a messenger, envoy, or delegate 2) an emissary to a foreign state representing the Pope

Practice: the condition of having mastery of a skill or activity through repetition (especially in the phrases **in practice, out of practice**)

Anomalous: deviating from the normal or usual order, type, etc.; irregular, abnormal, or incongruous

Go off: to become bad-tempered

Stay put: to refuse to leave; keep one's position

The X-Files: Fight the Future

Knock the breath/wind out of someone: to hit or throw someone, so that they cannot breathe easily

Jiggle: to move or cause to move up and down or to and fro with a short jerky motion: *to jiggle the door handle*

Up: appearing for trial: up before the magistrate

Disenchantment: a state of disappointment or disillusionment

Gestate: 1) to carry (developing young) in the uterus during pregnancy 2) to develop (a plan or idea) in the mind 3) to be in the process of gestating

Hantavirus: any one of a group of viruses that are transmitted to humans by rodents and cause disease of varying severity, ranging from a mild form of influenza to respiratory or kidney failure

Thrum: 1) to strum rhythmically but without expression on (a musical instrument) 2) to drum incessantly: *rain thrummed on the roof* 3) to repeat (something) monotonously

Lancinate: (especially of pain) sharp or cutting

Graze: (often followed by *against* or *along*) to brush or scrape (against) gently, especially in passing

Pathogen: any agent that can cause disease

Reconstitute: 1) to restore (food, etc.) to its former or natural state or a semblance of it, as by the addition of water to a concentrate: *reconstituted lemon juice* 2) to reconstruct; form again

Go over someone's head: 1) to go to a more important or powerful person in order to get what you want: *I was furious that he went over my head and complained to my manager.* 2) to be too difficult for someone to understand: *A lot of what was said in the meeting went right over my head.*

Hollow: without substance or validity

Dipwad: an obnoxious fool; a jerk

Chop-chop: used to indicate, often in a bossy or arrogant way, that somebody should hurry or do something quickly or right away

Carpe diem: enjoy the pleasures of the moment, without concern for the future

Pie in the sky: illusory hope or promise of some future good; false optimism

Omnibus: (prenominal) of, dealing with, or providing for many different things or cases

Unintelligible: not able to be understood; incomprehensible

Rattletrap: a broken-down old vehicle, especially an old car

Incontrovertible: incapable of being contradicted or disputed; undeniable

Brown-nose: 1) to be abjectly subservient (to); curry favour (with) 2) an abjectly subservient person; sycophant

Stab in the back: a) to do damage to the reputation of (a person, especially a friend) in a surreptitious way b) (noun) a treacherous action or remark that causes the downfall of or injury to a person

Implement: 1) a piece of equipment; tool or utensil: *gardening implements* 2) something used to achieve a purpose; agent

Viscera: (singular **viscus**)1) the large internal organs of the body collectively, especially those in the abdominal cavity Related adj: splanchnic 2) (less formally) the intestines; guts

Bleed: to draw liquid or gas out of a container or pressurized system: *bleed a radiator*

Call: to demand that (a player) expose his hand, after equalling his bet

Raise: to bet more than (the previous player)

Drive

Beet: 1) any chenopodiaceous plant of the genus Beta, especially the Eurasian species B. vulgaris, widely cultivated in such varieties as the sugar beet, mangelwurzel, beetroot, and spinach beet 2) the leaves of any of several varieties of this plant, which are cooked and eaten as a vegetable

Run down: to pursue and find or capture: to run down a fugitive

Scut: the short tail of animals such as the deer and rabbit

Bozo: a man, especially a stupid one

Doo-doo: a child's word for excrement

Petrous: 1) denoting the dense part of the temporal bone that surrounds the inner ear 2) like rock or stone

Tumefaction :1) the act or process of swelling 2) a puffy or swollen structure or part

Rammy: a noisy disturbance or free-for-all

In the clear: a) free of suspicion, guilt, or blame b) able to receive a pass without being tackled

Prosecute: 1) to bring a criminal action against (a person) for some offence 2) a) to seek redress by legal proceedings b) to institute or conduct a prosecution 3) to engage in or practise (a profession or trade) 4) to continue to do (a task, etc.)

Meter: 1) any device that measures and records the quantity of a substance, such as gas, that has passed through it during a specified period 2) any device that measures and sometimes records an electrical or magnetic quantity, such as current, voltage, etc.

Shingle: 1) a thin rectangular tile, especially one made of wood, that is laid with others in overlapping rows to cover a roof or a wall 2) a woman's short-cropped hairstyle 3) a small signboard or nameplate fixed outside the office of a doctor, lawyer, etc. 4) to cover (a roof or a wall) with shingles 5) to cut (the hair) in a short-cropped style

Pudknocker: a pretentious but unskilled pilot

Zoonosis: any infection or disease that is transmitted to man from lower vertebrates

Take someone at his / her word: to assume that someone means, or will do, what he or she says: when he told her to go, she took him at his word and left

Advisement: consultation; deliberation

Ground zero: 1) a point on the surface of land or water at or directly above or below the centre of a nuclear explosion 2) a scene of great devastation 3) (sometimes capitals) the name given to the devastated site of the collapsed World Trade Center towers in New York after September 11 2001

Off the hook: out of danger; free from obligation or guilt

Bill: to send or present an account for payment to (a person)

Triangle

Put one's back into: to devote all one's strength to (a task)

Heave-ho: 1) a sailors' cry, as when hoisting anchor 2) dismissal, as from employment

Rash: 1) acting without due consideration or thought; impetuous 2) characterized by or resulting from excessive haste or impetuosity: *a rash word*

Out of line (with something): 1) not properly lined up in a line of things. *I told you not to get out of line*. 2) beyond certain set or assumed limits. *Your bid on this project is completely out of line with our expectations*. 3) [of something said or behavior] improper. *I'm afraid that your behavior was quite out of line*.

Weasel: a sly or treacherous person

Swabbo=swabbie: sailor

Scuttle: to cause (a vessel) to sink by opening the seacocks or making holes in the bottom

Dreamland

Clandestine: secret and concealed, often for illicit reasons; furtive

Atingle: feeling a tingling sensation, often associated with excitement: *atingle with anticipation*

Caseload: the number of cases constituting the work of a doctor, solicitor, social worker, etc. over a specified period

Wuss: a feeble or effeminate person

Shell shock: loss of sight, memory, etc., resulting from psychological strain during prolonged engagement in warfare. Also called **combat neurosis**.

Birdie: a score of one stroke under par for a hole

Beam someone or something up (to some place): to transport someone or something (up) to something. (Originally in the context of a Star Trek adventure, but also used jocularly.) *The captain asked the first mate to beam him up.*

Farce: 1) a broadly humorous play based on the exploitation of improbable situations 2) the genre of comedy represented by works of this kind 3) a ludicrous situation or action

Buster: 1) (in combination) a person or thing destroying something as specified: *dambuster* 2) a term of address for a boy or man 3) a person who breaks horses 4) a spree, especially a drinking bout

Fly: to be acceptable, successful, or useful: come up with a proposal that will fly

Dreamland II

Slats: 1) the ribs 2) the buttocks

Fudge: foolishness; nonsense

Hassle: 1) to quarrel or wrangle 2) to cause annoyance or trouble to (someone); harass

Wingman: a pilot flying behind a leader

Scam: a crime in which criminals represent themselves as legitimate service providers and gain the confidence of their victims, only to steal from them

Innuendo: an indirect or subtle reference, especially one made maliciously or indicating criticism or disapproval; insinuation

Stockade: 1) an enclosure or barrier of stakes and timbers 2) a military prison or detention area

Slush: any watery muddy substance, especially melting snow

Pucky: feces; shit

To boot: as well; in addition: it's cold and musty, and damp to boot

Masher: a man who inflicts his attentions on a woman

Frump: a woman who is dowdy, drab, or unattractive

Jungian: of, following, or relating to the Swiss psychologist Carl Gustav Jung (1875-1961), his system of psychoanalysis, or to analytical psychology

Yore: time long past (now only in the phrase **of yore**)

Bough: any of the main branches of a tree

Sonogram: a three-dimensional representation of a sound signal, using coordinates of frequency, time, and intensity

Oddball: 1) also called **odd bod**, **odd fish:** a strange or eccentric person 2) strange or peculiar

Itch: to have a restless desire (to do something)

Sirree: an emphatic exclamation used with yes or no

Unconscionable: 1) unscrupulous or unprincipled: *an unconscionable liar* 2) immoderate or excessive: *unconscionable demands*

Scapula: 1) either of two large flat triangular bones, one on each side of the back part of the shoulder in man. Nontechnical name: **shoulder blade** 2) the corresponding bone in most vertebrates

Craniosynostosis: a condition in which the irregular joints between the cranial bony plates fuse together, usually before birth

Mandrake: 1) a Eurasian solanaceous plant, Mandragora officinarum, with purplish flowers and a forked root. It was formerly thought to have magic powers and a narcotic was prepared from its root 2) another name for the: May apple

Earful: 1) something heard or overheard 2) a rebuke or scolding, especially a lengthy or severe one

Osteology: the study of the structure and function of bones

Parietal: of, relating to, or forming the walls or part of the walls of a bodily cavity or similar structure: *the parietal bones of the skull*

Propagate: to reproduce or cause to reproduce; breed

The Rain King

Bone dry: extremely dry

Runted: not properly grown; having a growth shortage

Predicament: an unpleasant and difficult situation that is hard to get out of

Sniffle: to breathe audibly through the nose, as when the nasal passages are congested

Pronto: at once; promptly

Bearing: a person's general social conduct, especially in manners, dress, and behavior

Enchanting: pleasant; delightful

Plasmapheresis: (in blood transfusion) a technique for removing healthy or infected plasma by separating it from the red blood cells by settling or using a centrifuge and retransfusing the red blood cells into the donor or patient

Tithonus

Tithonus: the son of Laomedon of Troy who was loved by the goddess Eos. She asked that he be made immortal but forgot to ask that he be made eternally young. When he aged she turned him into a grasshopper.

Stringer: a journalist retained by a newspaper or news service on a part-time basis to cover a particular town or area

Wire service: an agency supplying news, etc., to newspapers, radio and television stations, etc.

On call: available to be called for work outside normal working hours

Hinky: 1) unstable or subject to sudden change: *hinky weather; My computer's been acting hinky.* 2) unusual in a way that is hard to describe: *something a little hinky in his behavior*

Geezer: a man

Have a nose for something: to have the ability to sense or find something, such as news, trouble, gossip, etc.: *She really has a nose for news. She 's a good reporter*.

Muck up: to ruin or spoil; make a mess of

Flit: to move along rapidly and lightly; skim or dart

Hyperbaric: of, concerned with, or operating at pressures higher than normal

Hurly-burly: 1) confusion or commotion 2) turbulent

Wile: trickery, cunning, or craftiness

Skitter: 1) (often followed by *off*) to move or run rapidly or lightly; scamper 2) to skim or cause to skim lightly and rapidly, as across the surface of water

Size up: 1) to make an assessment of (a person, problem, etc.) 2) to conform to or make so as to conform to certain specifications of dimension

To a T=to a tee: every detail; perfectly: the work suited her to a T.

Twister: 1) a swindling or dishonest person 2) a person or thing that twists, such as a device used in making ropes 3) an informal name for tornado 4) a ball moving with a twisting motion

Bunk: 1) a narrow shelflike bed fixed along a wall 2) short for bunk bed 3) any place where one sleeps

Break out: 1) to launch or introduce (a new product) 2) to open and start using: *break out the champagne*

Gesundheit: an expression used to wish good health to someone who has just sneezed

Run down: to pursue and find or capture: to run down a fugitive

Picket: a pointed stake, post, or peg that is driven into the ground to support a fence, provide a marker for surveying, etc.

Chintz: 1) a printed, patterned cotton fabric, with glazed finish 2) a painted or stained Indian calico

Preclude: [T] (formal) **preclude something; preclude somebody from doing something:** to prevent something from happening or somebody from doing something; to make something impossible: *Lack of time precludes any further discussion.*

Lien: a right to retain possession of another's property pending discharge of a debt

Milagro

Golconda: 1) a ruined town and fortress in S central India, in W Andhra Pradesh near Hyderabad city: capital of one of the five Muslim kingdoms of the Deccan from 1512 to 1687, then annexed to the Mogul empire; renowned for its diamonds 2) (sometimes not capital) a source of wealth or riches, especially a mine

Condign: (especially of a punishment) fitting; deserved

Titian: (sometimes not capital) reddish-gold, like the hair colour used in many of the works of Titian (original name Tiziano Vecellio), the Italian painter of the Venetian school (?1490-1576) Also called **Titian red.**

Bridle: 1) to put a bridle on (a horse, mule, etc.) 2) (of a horse) to respond correctly to the pull of the reins 3) to restrain; curb: *he bridled his rage* 4) (often followed by *at*) to show anger, scorn, or indignation

Heavy-handed: 1) clumsy 2) harsh and oppressive

Taken with someone or something: highly attracted to someone or something: *She was really quite taken with the young man who escorted her to the ball.*

Audacity: 1) daring or willingness to challenge assumptions or conventions or tackle something difficult or dangerous 2) lack of respect in somebody's behavior toward another person

Hegelian: of or relating Georg Wilhelm Friedrich Hegel, the German philosopher (1770-1831)

Expeditious: characterized by or done with speed and efficiency; prompt; quick

Impudent: 1) mischievous, impertinent, or disrespectful 2) an obsolete word for immodest

Infract: to violate or break (a law, an agreement, etc.)

Flush: a feeling of excitement or elation: the flush of success

Perforce: by necessity; unavoidably

Twinge: 1) a sudden brief darting or stabbing pain 2) a sharp emotional pang: *a twinge of guilt*

Palpation: a method of clinical examination using gentle pressure of the fingers to detect growths, changes in the size of underlying organs, and unusual tissue reactions to pressure

Pretzel: a brittle savory biscuit, in the form of a knot or stick, glazed and salted on the outside, eaten especially in Germany and the US

Tank: 1) to defeat heavily 2) to fail, especially commercially

Drift: the general meaning of an argument, opinion, or statement: *She used a lot of technical jargon but I managed to get the drift of her argument.*

Mitt: 1) any of various glovelike hand coverings, such as one that does not cover the fingers 2) short for mitten 3) a large round thickly padded leather mitten worn by the catcher in baseball

Horse's ass: a stupid and annoying person: You may think you're being funny, but everyone else thinks you're being a real horse's ass.

Shag: 1) to run and retrieve something 2) to chase, catch, and return fly balls in baseball practice 3) to chase somebody or something away

Crackpot: 1) an eccentric person; crank 2) (usually prenominal) eccentric; crazy

Three of a Kind

Boink: to copulate with

Crapola: rubbish; nonsense

Flush: (in poker and similar games) a hand containing only one suit

Delaminate: to divide or cause to divide into thin layers

Stall: to employ delaying tactics towards (someone); be evasive

Wetwork: a euphemism for murder or assassination, alluding to spilling blood

Boobage: a woman's breasts; breasts in genera

Stooge: 1) an actor who feeds lines to a comedian or acts as his foil or butt 2) someone who is taken advantage of by another

Poo-Bah: a pompous self-important official holding several offices at once and fulfilling none of them

Putz: a despicable or stupid person

Negatory: marked by negation; denying; negative

Anoesis: a state of mind consisting of pure sensation or emotion without cognitive content. Adjective form: **anoetic**

Bimbo: 1) an attractive but empty-headed young woman 2) a fellow; person especially a foolish one

P.O.'d: pissed off

Tromp: walk heavily

Off one's nut: mad, crazy, or foolish

Sludge: 1) soft mud, snow, etc. 2) any deposit or sediment 3) a surface layer of ice that has a slushy appearance 4) (in sewage disposal) the solid constituents of sewage that precipitate during treatment and are removed for subsequent purification

Pepsin: a proteolytic enzyme produced in the stomach in the inactive form pepsinogen, which, when activated by acid, splits proteins into peptones

Thyroid: 1) of or relating to the thyroid gland, an endocrine gland of vertebrates, consisting in man of two lobes near the base of the neck. It secretes hormones that control metabolism and body growth 2) of or relating to the largest cartilage of the larynx

Progenitor: 1) a direct ancestor 2) an originator or founder of a future development; precursor

The Sixth Extinction

Beset: 1) (especially of dangers, temptations, or difficulties) to trouble or harass constantly 2) to surround or attack from all sides 3) to cover with, especially with jewels

Temporal lobe: the laterally protruding portion of each cerebral hemisphere, situated below the parietal lobe and associated with sound perception and interpretation: it is thought to be the centre for memory recall

Haloperidol: a tranquilizing drug. Use: treatment of schizophrenia, mania, and psychoses

Animism: 1) the belief that natural objects, phenomena, and the universe itself have desires and intentions 2) (in the philosophies of the Greek philosophers Plato (?427-?347 BC) and Pythagoras (?580-?500 BC)) the hypothesis that there is an immaterial force that animates the universe

Swanky: 1) expensive and showy; stylish: *a swanky hotel* 2) boastful or conceited

Phenytoin: an anticonvulsant drug used in the management of epilepsy and in the treatment of abnormal heart rhythms. Formula: C15H11N2O2Na

Conjoin: to join or become joined

The Sixth Extinction II: Amor Fati

Adulation: obsequious flattery or praise; extreme admiration

For want of: because of a lack of (something): for want of a better location we ate our picnic lunch in the cemetery

Beckon: [I, T] to show somebody with a movement of your finger or hand that you want him/her to come closer: *She beckoned me over to speak to her.*

Foretell: to tell or indicate (an event, a result, etc.) beforehand; predict

Allay: 1) to relieve (pain, grief, etc.) or be relieved 2) to reduce (fear, anger, etc.)

Touchstone: 1) a standard by which something is judged 2) a hard black stone formerly used to test the purity of gold and silver according to the color of the streak left when the metal was rubbed against it

Hungry

Patty: 1) a small flattened cake of minced food 2) a small pie

Drive-thru: a) a takeaway restaurant, bank, etc. designed so that customers can use it without leaving their cars b) (as modifier) a drive-thru restaurant

Disinter: 1) to remove or dig up; exhume 2) to bring (a secret, hidden facts, etc.) to light; expose

Sterling: (prenominal) genuine and reliable; first-class: sterling quality

Necromancy: 1) the art or practice of supposedly conjuring up the dead, especially in order to obtain from them knowledge of the future 2) black magic; sorcery

Divulge: [T] (formal) to tell something that is secret: *The phone companies refused to divulge details of their costs.*

Arcane: secret

Ouroboros: an ancient symbol depicting a serpent or dragon eating its own

Disrepute: a loss or lack of credit or repute

Single-minded: having but one aim or purpose; dedicated

Schism: 1) the division of a group into opposing factions 2) the factions so formed

Funeral parlor: a place where the dead are prepared for burial or cremation. Usual US name: funeral home

Mangle: 1) to mutilate, disfigure, or destroy by cutting, crushing, or tearing 2) to ruin, spoil, or mar

Unravel: 1) to remove the knots from a piece of string, thread, etc.; to come unfastened in this way: I unraveled the tangled string and wound it into a hall

2) (used about a complicated story, etc.) to become or to make something become clear

Rush

Be cut out for something; be cut out to be something: to have the qualities needed to do something; to be suitable for something/somebody: *You're not cut out to be a soldier.*

Maxilla: 1) the upper jawbone in vertebrates 2) any member of one or two pairs of mouthparts in insects and other arthropods used as accessory jaws

Dullsville: 1) a thing, place, or activity that is boring or dull 2) the state of being bored

Hillbilly: 1) an unsophisticated person, especially from the mountainous areas in the southeastern US 2) another name for country music

Clobber: 1) to beat or batter 2) to defeat utterly 3) to criticize severely

Half-assed=half-arsed: incompetent; inept; badly organized

Straight: honest, respectable, or reliable

Translucent: allowing light to pass through partially or diffusely; semitransparent

Move in (on): to try to gain power or influence (over) or interfere (with)

Glob: a rounded mass of some thick fluid or pliable substance: a glob of cream

Acidosis: a condition characterized by an abnormal increase in the acidity of the blood and extracellular fluids

Buzz: a) a pleasant sensation, as from a drug such as cannabis b) a sense of excitement; kick

Effects: 1) also called **personal effects:** personal property or belongings 2) lighting, sounds, etc., to accompany and enhance a stage, film, or broadcast production

Guano: 1) a) the dried excrement of fish-eating sea birds, deposited in rocky coastal regions of South America: contains the urates, oxalates, and phosphates of ammonium and calcium; used as a fertilizer b) the accumulated droppings of bats and seals 2) any similar but artificial substance used as a fertilizer

Slowpoke: a person who moves, acts, or works slowly. Also called (in Britain and certain other countries) **slowcoach.**

Impervious: 1) not able to be penetrated, as by water, light, etc.; impermeable 2) (often postpositive; followed by *to*) not able to be influenced (by) or not receptive (to): *impervious to argument*

Orison

Orison: another word for prayer

Forte: something at which a person excels; strong point: cooking is my forte

Make out: to engage in necking or petting: Alan is making out with Jane.

Buff: to clean or polish something with a piece of soft material

 $\boldsymbol{Missy:}$ an affectionate or sometimes disparaging form of address to a young girl

Cuticle: 1) dead skin, especially that round the base of a fingernail or toenail 2) another name for epidermis 3) any covering layer or membrane 4) the protective layer, containing cutin, that covers the epidermis of higher plants 5) the hard protective layer covering the epidermis of many invertebrates

Handiwork: 1) work performed or produced by hand, such as embroidery or pottery 2) the result of the action or endeavors of a person or thing

Landau: a four-wheeled carriage, usually horse-drawn, with two folding hoods that meet over the middle of the passenger compartment

Root: 1) (of a pig) to burrow in or dig up the earth in search of food, using the snout 2) (followed by *about*, *around*, *in* etc.) to search vigorously but unsystematically

(Have a few tricks) up one's sleeve: (to have options, etc.) secretly ready

Swimmingly: successfully, effortlessly, or well (especially in the phrase **go swimmingly**)

Up the creek: in trouble; in a difficult position

Protégé: a person who is protected and aided by the patronage of another

Ensnare or **insnare**: 1) to catch or trap in a snare 2) to trap or gain power over someone by dishonest or underhand means

Escapology: the skill of escaping from restraints or confinement as a form of entertainment

Pilfer: to steal (minor items), especially in small quantities

Prestidigitation: another name for sleight of hand

Rattler: a rattlesnake

Herpetology: the scientific study of reptiles and amphibians

Life and limb: continued existence or serious injury: *These skiers risk life and limb every day for the thrill of a super-fast downhill run. The storms across the west are posing a threat to life and limb.*

Animus: 1) intense dislike; hatred; animosity 2) motive, intention, or purpose 3) (in Jungian psychology) the masculine principle present in the female unconscious

Transubstantiation: 1) (especially in Roman Catholic theology) a) the doctrine that the whole substance of the bread and wine changes into the substance of the body and blood of Christ when consecrated in the Eucharist b) the mystical process by which this is believed to take place during consecration 2) a substantial change; transmutation

Slithery: 1) moving with a slithering motion 2) suggestive of a slithering creature

Fancy-free: having no commitments; carefree

Ramble: to talk or write for a long time, not always keeping to the intended subject or tending to change the subject: *The speaker rambled on for over an hour.*

Cast out: to drive out by force; expel

Sein und Zeit

Starstruck: completely overawed by someone's celebrity status

Pool: any communal combination of resources, funds, etc. a typing pool

From here on in: from here on out

Royally: excessively; thoroughly: He will be royally annoyed if you change his work.

Bust one's bust: to work exceptionally hard: *I've been busting my butt getting the tent fixed, while you're just sipping cocoa. Give me a hand.*

Diazepam: a chemical compound used as a minor tranquillizer and muscle relaxant and to treat acute epilepsy. Formula: C16H13ClN2O

Walk-in: a person whose original soul has departed the body and been replaced with another

Starlight: the light emanating from the stars

Recompense: 1) compensation for loss, injury, etc.: *to make recompense* 2) reward, remuneration, or repayment

Foolproof: 1) proof against failure; infallible: *a foolproof idea* 2) (especially of machines) proof against human misuse, error, etc.

Precognitive: pertaining to the ability to see or predict future events

Garden-variety: ordinary, common, or unexceptional: *I can usually recover from a garden-variety cold with rest and fluids.*

Knucklehead: fool; idiot

Wireframe: a skeletal three-dimensional model in which only lines and vertices are represented

Flintlock: 1) an obsolete gunlock in which the charge is ignited by a spark produced by a flint in the hammer 2) a firearm having such a lock

Voluptuous: 1) relating to, characterized by, or consisting of pleasures of the body or senses; sensual 2) disposed, devoted, or addicted to sensual indulgence or luxurious pleasures 3) provocative and sexually alluring, especially through shapeliness or fullness: *a voluptuous woman*

Vixen: 1) a female fox 2) a quarrelsome or spiteful woman

Moony: 1) dreamy or listless 2) of or like the moon 3) crazy or foolish

Sphinx: 1) any of a number of huge stone statues built by the ancient Egyptians, having the body of a lion and the head of a man 2) an inscrutable person

Three-ply: 1) having three layers or thicknesses 2) a) (of knitting wool, etc.) three-stranded b) (as noun) *the sweater was knitted in three-ply*

Get one's ya-yas out: enjoy oneself in an uninhibited way

Gratuitous: 1) given or received without payment or obligation 2) without cause; unjustified 3) given or made without receiving any value in return: *a gratuitous agreement*

Broadsword: a broad-bladed sword used for cutting rather than stabbing

Dope: cool

Pick on: to select (someone) for something unpleasant, especially in order to bully, blame, or cause to perform a distasteful task

Theef

Profiterole: a small case of choux pastry with a sweet or savory filling

Hexcraft: the practice, art, or skill of casting hexes and spells; sorcery; witchcraft

Poultice: 1) also called **cataplasm:** a local moist and often heated application for the skin consisting of substances such as kaolin, linseed, or mustard, used to improve the circulation, treat inflamed areas, etc. 2) a large sum of money, especially a debt

Kuru: a degenerative disease of the nervous system, restricted to certain tribes in New Guinea, marked by loss of muscular control and thought to be caused by a slow virus

Call: a decision or judgment: it's your call

Rest: to continue to be (as specified); remain: rest assured

Rescind: to annul or repeal

Heat: police activity after a crime: the heat is off

Unadulterated: not debased or made impure

Trust: a person or thing in which confidence or faith is placed

Chimera

Dame: a woman of rank or dignity; lady

Seamy: 1) showing the least pleasant aspect; sordid 2) (especially of the inner side of a garment) showing many seams

Privation: 1) loss or lack of the necessities of life, such as food and shelter 2) hardship resulting from this 3) the state of being deprived

Dregs: 1) solid particles that tend to settle at the bottom of some liquids, such as wine or coffee 2) residue or remains

Bearing: (followed by on or upon) relevance (to): it has no bearing on this problem

Talon: 1) a sharply hooked claw, especially of a bird of prey 2) anything resembling a bird's claw

Vasectomy: a surgical operation in which the vas deferens from each testis is cut and tied to prevent transfer of sperm during ejaculation. It is the most common form of male sterilization.

Short-handed: 1) lacking the usual or necessary number of assistants, workers, etc. 2) with less than the full complement of players

Out of the running: no longer being considered; eliminated from a contest: After the first part of the diving meet, three members of our team were out of the running.

Inkling: [C, usually sing.] **an inkling (of something /that...)** a slight feeling (about something): *I had an inkling that something was wrong.*

Halfway: in or of an incomplete manner or nature

Take stock: a) to make an inventory b) to make a general appraisal, especially of prospects, resources, etc.

Ectoplasm: 1) the outer layer of cytoplasm in some cells, especially protozoa, which differs from the inner cytoplasm (see endoplasm) in being a clear gel 2) the substance supposedly emanating from the body of a medium during trances

Echocardiography: examination of the heart using ultrasound techniques

Pericarditis: inflammation of the pericardium, the membranous sac enclosing the heart

Prednisone: a steroid drug derived from cortisone and having the same uses

Interminable: endless or seemingly endless because of monotony or tiresome length

Pyrrolidine: an almost colorless liquid occurring in tobacco leaves and made commercially by hydrogenating pyrrole. It is a strongly alkaline heterocyclic base with molecules that contain a ring of four carbon atoms and one nitrogen atom.

Pyridine: a colorless hygroscopic liquid with a characteristic odor. It is a basic heterocyclic compound containing one nitrogen atom and five carbon atoms in its molecules and is used as a solvent and in preparing other organic chemicals.

Trigger-happy: 1) tending to resort to the use of firearms or violence irresponsibly 2) tending to act rashly or without due consideration

Tease out: to extract (information) with difficulty

Overweening: 1) (of a person) excessively arrogant or presumptuous 2) (of opinions, appetites, etc.) excessive; immoderate

Peddle: 1) to go from place to place selling (goods, especially small articles) 2) to sell (illegal drugs, especially narcotics) 3) to advocate (ideas) persistently or importunately: *to peddle a new philosophy*

Stouthearted: valiant; brave

Edict: 1) a decree, order, or ordinance issued by a sovereign, state, or any other holder of authority 2) any formal or authoritative command, proclamation, etc.

Chitchat: talk of a gossipy nature

Mortuary: 1) also called **morgue:** a building where dead bodies are kept before cremation or burial 2) of or relating to death or burial

Headstone: a memorial stone at the head of a grave

Mind one's p's and q's: practice good manners, be precise and careful in one's behavior and speech: *Their grandmother often told the children to mind their p's and q's*. The origin of this expression, first recorded in 1779, is disputed. Siddhi: 1) in Hinduism, the complete spiritual understanding and insight that is the goal of meditation and other practices 2) a paranormal power believed to be acquired by a Hindu ascetic who has attained enlightenment

Flat-footed: 1) having feet with arches so low that all the sole makes contact with the ground 2) with both feet on the ground 3) unable to react or respond quickly: *Her question caught me flat-footed.*

Marina: an elaborate docking facility for pleasure boats

Preponderance: the quality of being greater in weight, force, influence, etc.: the preponderance of right-handed people

House-warming: a) a party given after moving into a new home b) (as modifier) *a house-warming party*

Thereabouts: near that place, time, amount, etc.: fifty or thereabouts

Potted: cooked or preserved in a pot: potted shrimps

Corker: 1) a) something or somebody striking or outstanding: *that was a corker of a joke* b) an irrefutable remark that puts an end to discussion 2) a person or machine that inserts corks

Waterworks: crying; tears

Lord of the Flies

Forewarn: to warn beforehand

Scrumptious: very pleasing; delicious

Goad: 1) a sharp pointed stick for urging on cattle, etc. 2) anything that acts as a spur or incitement

Brush up: 1) (often followed by *on*) to refresh one's knowledge, skill, or memory of (a subject) 2) to make (a person or oneself) tidy, clean, or neat as after a journey

Run down: to read swiftly or perfunctorily: he ran down their list of complaints

Run-in: skirmish

Picogram: one-trillionth of a gram

Whisperer: 1) a person or thing that whispers 2) a person who is able to tame or control animals, especially by talking to them in gentle tones: a horse whisperer

Kleenex: a kind of soft paper tissue, used especially as a handkerchief

Act out: 1) to reproduce (an idea, former event, etc.) in actions, often by mime 2) to express unconsciously (a repressed impulse or experience) in overt behavior

Chug: a short dull sound, especially one that is rapidly repeated, such as that made by an engine

Probable cause: reasonable grounds for holding a belief, especially such as will justify bringing legal proceedings against a person or will constitute a defense to a charge of malicious prosecution

On a tear: showing a sudden burst of energy

On the rampage: behaving violently or destructively

Trust No 1

Tip one's hand: 1) in card playing, to accidentally reveal one's cards or hand 2) to inadvertently reveal any secret, particularly a secret that puts one at an advantage or disadvantage

Petechia: a minute discolored spot on the surface of the skin or mucous membrane, caused by an underlying ruptured blood vessel

Pet peeve: something that is personally annoying; a personal dislike: *Ending questions with a period is one of my pet peeves.*

Coyote: a smuggler who brings illegal immigrants into the United States

Lock, stock, and barrel: completely; entirely

Tax: to make heavy demands on; strain: to tax one's intellect

Disappear: to make a political opponent disappear by arresting or killing the person without due process of law: *It wasn't the first time they had disappeared someone who was in the way.*

Sitter: a baby-sitter

Odd: used to designate an indefinite quantity more than the quantity specified in round numbers: *fifty-odd pounds*

Hothead: an excitable or fiery person

Tibia: 1) also called **shinbone:** the inner and thicker of the two bones of the human leg between the knee and ankle 2) the corresponding bone in other vertebrates 3) the fourth segment of an insect's leg, lying between the femur and the tarsus

Girdle: any encircling structure or part

Touch-and-go: highly uncertain or unpredictable (not hyphenated after a verb): *a touch-and-go situation*

Provenance

Provenance: a place of origin, especially that of a work of art or archaeological specimen

Encrust: 1) to cover or overlay with or as with a crust or hard coating 2) to form or cause to form a crust or hard coating 3) to decorate lavishly, as with jewels

Mincing: (of a person) affectedly elegant in gait, manner, or speech

Providence

Providence: 1) a) *Christianity* God's foreseeing protection and care of his creatures b) such protection and care as manifest by some other force 2) a supposed manifestation of such care and guidance 3) the foresight or care exercised by a person in the management of his affairs or resources

Forebode: 1) to warn of or indicate (an event, result, etc.) in advance 2) to have an intuition or premonition of (an event)

Follow (hard) on the heels of something: to happen very soon after something else: *The factory closure follows hard on the heels of several others.*

Whitewash: [U] 1) a white liquid that you use for painting walls 2) [sing.] trying to hide unpleasant facts about somebody/something: *The opposition claimed the report was a whitewash*. Verb: [T] 1) to paint whitewash onto a wall 2) to try to hide something bad or wrong that you have done

Lock on to: (of a radar beam) to automatically follow (a target)

Chapel: 1) a place of Christian worship in a larger building, especially a place set apart, with a separate altar, in a church or cathedral 2) a similar place of worship in or attached to a large house or institution, such as a college, hospital or prison 3) a church subordinate to a parish church

Apt: 1) suitable for the circumstance or purpose; appropriate 2) (postpositive; followed by an infinitive) having a tendency (to behave as specified) 3) having the ability to learn and understand easily; clever (especially in the phrase **an apt pupil**)

Come around: to become conscious again after being unconscious

To the letter: a) following the literal interpretation or wording exactly b) attending to every detail

Back-pedal: 1) to turn the pedals of a bicycle backwards 2) to retract or modify a previous opinion, principle, etc. 3) *boxing* to take backward steps

Guile: clever or crafty character or behavior

Living will: a document stating that if its author becomes terminally ill, his or her life should not be prolonged by artificial means, such as a life-support machine

At the end of the day: in the final reckoning

Prognosis: 1) *medicine* a) a prediction of the course or outcome of a disease or disorder b) the chances of recovery from a disease 2) any forecast or prediction

Subdural: between the dura mater and the arachnoid: subdural hematoma

Deposition: 1) a) the giving of testimony on oath b) the testimony so given c) the sworn statement of a witness used in court in his absence 2) the act or instance of deposing 3) the act or an instance of depositing 4) something that is deposited; deposit

Posthaste: with great haste; as fast as possible

Contrition: deeply felt remorse; penitence

Meat-and-potatoes: fundamental or most important

Amalgam: 1) an alloy of mercury with another metal, especially with silver: *dental amalgam* 2) a rare white metallic mineral that consists of silver and mercury and occurs in deposits of silver and cinnabar 3) a blend or combination

Naivity: 1) the state or quality of being naive; ingenuousness; simplicity 2) a naive act or statement

Rag: a newspaper or other journal, especially one considered as worthless, sensational, etc.

Nemesis: 1) the goddess of retribution and vengeance 2) (sometimes not capital) any agency of retribution and vengeance

Talk shop: to speak about one's work, especially when meeting socially, sometimes with the effect of excluding those not similarly employed

Outhouse: 1) a building near to, but separate from, a main building; outbuilding 2) an outside lavatory

Teenybopper: a young teenager, usually a girl, who avidly follows fashions in clothes and pop music

Elasmobranch: any cartilaginous fish of the subclass Elasmobranchii (or Selachii), which includes the sharks, rays, dogfish, and skates

Piggyback: 1) to give (a person) a piggyback on one's back and shoulders 8) to transport (one vehicle) on another 2) (often followed by *on*) to exploit an existing resource, system, or product 3) to attach to or mount on (an existing piece of equipment or system)

Imponderable: unable to be weighed or assessed

Airtight: 1) not permitting the passage of air either in or out 2) having no weak points; rigid or unassailable: *this categorization is hardly airtight*

Pull strings: to exert personal influence, especially secretly or unofficially

Diaphoretic: relating to or causing sweat

Release

Lacerate: 1) to tear (the flesh, etc.) jaggedly 2) to hurt or harrow (the feelings, etc.)

Hilt: the handle or shaft of a sword, dagger, etc.

Bop: strike; hit

Indictment: 1) a formal written charge of crime formerly referred to and presented on oath by a grand jury 2) any formal accusation of crime 3) a

charge of crime brought at the instance of the Lord Advocate 4) the act of indicting or the state of being indicted

Sicko: a person who is mentally disturbed or perverted

Sunshine Days

Crowd: to press together into a confined space

Stonewall: 1) *cricket* (of a batsman) to play defensively 2) to obstruct or hinder (parliamentary business)

Get out of someone's hair: to stop annoying someone: Will you get out of my hair! You are a real pain!

Shingle: a thin rectangular tile, especially one made of wood that is laid with others in overlapping rows to cover a roof or a wall

Get the hang of: a) to understand the technique of doing something b) to perceive the meaning or significance of

Lose one's marbles: go insane

Call someone's bluff: to challenge someone to give proof of his claims

Whatnot: 1) also called **what-d'you-call-it:** a person or thing the name of which is unknown, temporarily forgotten, or deliberately overlooked 2) unspecified assorted material 3) a portable stand with shelves, used for displaying ornaments, etc.

Understatement: the act or an instance of stating something in restrained terms, or as less than it is

At the end of one's rope: so harassed or troubled that you are at the limit of your ability to cope; from a tethered horse being unable to reach more grass to eat because its rope is fully stretched

Pest: 1) a person or thing that annoys, especially by imposing itself when it is not wanted; nuisance 2) a) any organism that damages crops, injures or irritates livestock or man, or reduces the fertility of land b) (as modifier) pest control 3) an epidemic disease or pestilence

Jinx: an unlucky or malevolent force, person, or thing

Vindication: a means of exoneration from an accusation

Drop the other shoe: to do the deed that completes something; to do the expected remaining part of something

Psychic: a person who is sensitive to parapsychological forces or influences

(As) happy as a clam (at high tide): extremely happy

Cold call: to call on (a potential customer) without making an appointment

Bugger: a highly offensive term meaning to practice anal intercourse with somebody

Put up: to provide or supply; give: to put up a good fight

Pull something out of one's ass: to produce something, especially information or an idea, unexpectedly

Expiation: the act, process, or a means of expiating; atonement

Purview: 1) the scope of operation or concern of something 2) the breadth or range of outlook or understanding 3) the body of a statute, containing the enacting clauses

Palliative: serving to palliate; relieving without curing

Infarction: 1) the formation or development of an infarct 2) another word for infarct

Intrathecal: occurring within or administered into the spinal theca: *intrathecal injection*

Tarmac: a paving material that consists of crushed stone rolled and bound with a mixture of tar and bitumen, especially as formerly used for a road, airport runway, etc.

Émigré: an emigrant, especially one forced to leave his native country for political reasons

Sweet talk: flatter



Claptrap: 1) contrived but foolish talk 2) insincere and pretentious talk: *politicians' claptrap*

Stoop: (often followed by to): to abase or degrade oneself

Huddle: to crowd or cause to crowd or nestle closely together

Founder's Mutation

Humdinger: 1) something unusually large: a humdinger of a recession 2) an excellent person or thing: a humdinger of a party

Pluripotent: capable of differentiating into different types of body cell

Pronouncement: 1) an official or authoritative statement or announcement 2) the act of pronouncing, declaring, or uttering formally

Antiseptic: 1) of, relating to, or effecting antisepsis 2) entirely free from contamination 3) lacking spirit or excitement; clinical

Relay: 1) to receive and then pass on a signal or message: *Instructions were relayed to us by phone.* 2) to put a program on the radio or television

Proteus syndrome: a condition caused by malfunction in cell growth, in which bone and flesh tissue overgrow in localized areas of the body

Crouzon syndrome: a genetic disorder characterized by the premature fusion of certain skull bones (craniosynostosis)

Dysplasia: abnormal development of an organ or part of the body, including congenital absence

Pitt-Hopkins syndrome: a rare genetic disorder characterized by developmental delay, a wide mouth, distinctive facial features, and intermittent hyperventilation followed by apnea

Marfan syndrome: a genetic disorder that affects the body's connective tissue

Ulna: 1) the inner and longer of the two bones of the human forearm 2) the corresponding bone in other vertebrates

Adjudicate: (usually followed by upon) to give a decision (on), especially a formal or binding one

Mulder and Scully Meet the Were-Monster

Whatzit=whatsit: something whose name is unknown or forgotten

Sasquatch: (in Canadian folklore) in British Columbia, a hairy beast or manlike monster said to leave huge footprints

Mothman: a legendary creature, regarded as a cryptid or alien, reportedly seen in West Virginia in the mid-1960s

Jackalope: a mythical animal of North American folklore (a fearsome critter) described as a jackrabbit with antelope horns

Mountain lion: puma

Boxers=boxer shorts: men's underpants shaped like shorts but having a front opening

Briefs: a short type of underpants worn by men or boys

Slither: to move or slide or cause to move or slide unsteadily, as on a slippery surface

Squint: 1) to cross or partly close (the eyes) 2) to have a squint 3) to look or glance sideways or askance

Peeping Tom: a man who furtively observes women undressing; voyeur

GMO: genetically modified organism

Raving: (usually plural) frenzied, irrational, or wildly extravagant talk or utterances

Batcrap: used as an intensifier, particularly for insane or synonyms

Constable: 1) (in Britain, Australia, Canada, New Zealand, etc.) a police officer of the lowest rank 2) any of various officers of the peace, especially one who arrests offenders, serves writs, etc. 3) the keeper or governor of a royal castle or fortress 4) (in medieval Europe) the chief military officer and functionary of a royal household, especially in France and England 5) an officer of a hundred in medieval England, originally responsible for raising the military levy but later assigned other administrative duties

Get (something) off one's chest: to unburden oneself of troubles, worries, etc., by talking about them

Shocker: 1) a person or thing that shocks or horrifies 2) a sensational novel, film, or play

Hickey: a mark on the skin, especially a lovebite

Satiate: 1) to fill or supply beyond capacity or desire, often arousing weariness 2) to supply to satisfaction or capacity

Disconcert: 1) to disturb the composure of 2) to frustrate or upset

Transfix: 1) to render motionless, especially with horror or shock 2) to impale or fix with a sharp weapon or other device 3) to cut through (a limb or other organ), as in amputation

Porta-potty: a portable toilet, (in Britain, chiefly) a chemical toilet comprised of only the fixture rather than an entire enclosure

Fuzz: a slang word for police or policeman

Fink: 1) a strikebreaker; blackleg 2) an informer, such as one working for the police; spy 3) an unpleasant, disappointing, or contemptible person

Home Again

Polyvinyl: (modifier) designating a plastic or resin formed by polymerization of a vinyl derivative

Siloxane: any of a class of compounds containing alternate silicon and oxygen atoms with the silicon atoms bound to hydrogen atoms or organic groups. Many are highly complex polymers

Supraspinatus: a small muscle at the top of the shoulder blade

Deltoideus: short for deltoideus muscle much as deltoid is used as short for deltoid muscle

Injunction: 1) an instruction or order issued by a court to a party to an action, especially to refrain from some act, such as causing a nuisance 2) a command, admonition, etc. 3) the act of enjoining

Gentrification: a process by which middle-class people take up residence in a traditionally working-class area of a city, changing the character of the area

Slat: a narrow thin strip of wood or metal, as used in a Venetian blind, etc.

Extubate: to remove a tube from a hollow organ or from an airway

Stent: a tube of plastic or sprung metal mesh placed inside a hollow tube to reopen it or keep it open; uses in surgery include preventing a blood vessel from closing, especially after angioplasty, and assisting healing after an anastomosis

Babylon

Impertinence or **impertinency:** 1) disrespectful behavior or language; rudeness; insolence 2) an impertinent act, gesture, etc. 3) lack of pertinence; irrelevance; inappropriateness

Theosophism=theosophy: 1) any of various forms of philosophical or religious thought claiming a mystical insight into the divine nature and natural phenomena

2) the system of belief and practice of the Theosophical Society

Woo-woo: based on or involving irrational superstition

Banish: 1) to expel from a place, especially by an official decree as a punishment 2) to drive away

Ignominy: 1) disgrace or public shame; dishonor 2) a cause of disgrace; a shameful act

Seer: 1) a person who can supposedly see into the future; prophet 2) a person who professes supernatural powers 3) a person who sees

Mugwump: a neutral or independent person, especially in politics

Niacin=nicotinic acid: a vitamin of the B complex that occurs in milk, liver, yeast, etc. Lack of it in the diet leads to the disease pellagra

Hubris: 1) pride or arrogance 2) (in Greek tragedy) an excess of ambition, pride, etc., ultimately causing the transgressor's ruin

Shroom=magic mushroom: any of various types of fungi that contain a hallucinogenic substance, especially Psilocybe mexicana, which contains psilocybin
